## Easy Dill Sauce for Salmon/Fish

2 extra large eggs  
4 T fresh lemon juice  
1/3 C dry white wine  
2 T chopped fresh dill or 2 t dried dill  
Salt & Pepper to taste

Separate the eggs. In a small bowl beat egg whites til frothy. Wisk in the yolks & lemon juice. Add white wine & transfer to a small pan. Cook on low, stirring constantly, til thickened. Stir in dill, salt & pepper. It will thicken more as it sits/cool. Makes 1 cup.

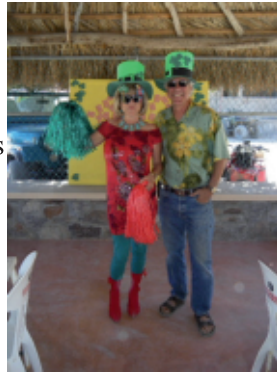

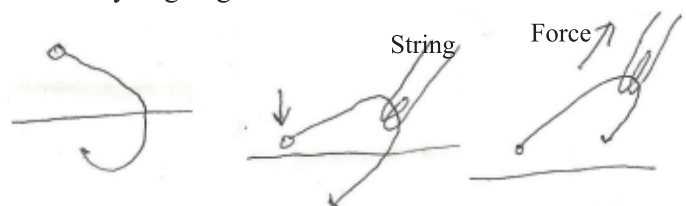

## How to Remove Fish Hooks painlessly with a shoe lace

- Immobilize the part i.e. HOLD STILL
- Press the eye of the hook against the skin (this changes the angle of the barb)
- Place a shoe string (or similar cord) about the loop or bend of the hook
- Give one wharp tug on the string while keeping the part immobile and the eye depressed against skin
- Done painlessly

I have personally removed many hooks this way in the ER, and also removed tow barbs of a treble hook on one occasion. The patients usual response (after the hook is removed) is "when are you going to do it?"



# Fishing

**Reporting period: Feb. 23 through March 22, 2011**

Note: Missing dates normally mean that the wind contributed to boats not going out to fish.

**2/23** Redrover San Pedro, 2 limits of big Yellowtail and Goldies

**2/24** Perry Dize, Redrover, Mi Amor-San Pedro Goldies, no Yellowtail. Sandollar-also caught Goldies and 1 Grouper.

**2/25** GatorBait and Pandamonium went to San Esteban - bottom fish - slow, water temps 58-59 degrees.

**3/2** Papa Jo and Redrover went to Turner. Redrover caught a limit of Goldies.

**3/7** Jayhawker, Wet Willy, Sand Dollar, Pandamonium, Perry Dize, Redrover and Rosie all went to San Pedro and returned home in rough water with some bottom fish and reported fishing generally slow. 13-0-13 and Gatorbait also went to San Pedro each caught 4 nice groupers plus Goldies. Sea Dancer caught 1 nice Grouper plus bottom fish. Water temp 57.8

**Last One, Tzi Gane, El Sueno, Nosotros Dos** all fished the Turner/Deadman/Colorado Pt areas and caught bottom fish. Fishfinder went to 14 mile reef and caught limits of nice Rock Bass.

**3/11** Nice day, and a few boats go out to locate fish and "stake thier claims " in

preparation for the club's Fishing Derby that begins tomorrow. Received the following reports: Fishfinder, Dakota, Sand Dollar fished the Turner/Deadman/ Colorado Pt areas and all caught bottom fish. Boat Jockey went to 14 mile reef and came home with limits of big Rock Bass, some in the 2 lb class.

## 3/12 CLUB DEPORTIVO FISHING

**DERBY BEGINS** About 10 boats go out but the only report received was from the Jayhawker who weighed in a 5.6 lb Goldie, fishing was slow.

**3/13** 14 boats go out but the only reports received was from the 13-013 who went to San Pedro and weighed in a 32 lb Grouper. Redrover went to San Pedro and weighed in a 31lb Pinto and a 6.3 lb Goldie.

**3/16** Great weather and sea conditions. 17 boats head out to various fishing locations. Redrover- San Esteban 1 small Grouper and limits of big Goldies weighed in a 7.3 lb Sand Dollar and Jayhawker- San Pedro, bottom fish, Sea Shell-14 mile reef, limits of nice Rock Bass. 13-0-13 boat had a great day at San Pedro. Besides a limit of nice Goldies they brought home their limits 9 Grouper ( both Gulf and Snowy types ) They also caught 3 Rosie Conie fish. ( These fish look like a Grouper except that they have a rose color and are excellent eating ) This reporter remembers catching many of these about 25 years ago, but have not seen one in this many years until now. Montana Falkonito caught their limit of nice Rock Bass and a small Corvina, about 2 miles from the North ramp. Wet Willy

went to San Pedro and came home with 6 Yellowtail and a Grouper and a box of Goldies.

**3/17** Fishfinder, Jayhawker, and Last One all fished the San Esteban area and all reported it slow. Montana Falkonito fished local and also said it was slow.

**3/18** Redrover San Pedro 8 nice Yellowtail and a Grouper. Sea Dancer San Pedro 6 big Yellowtail 20-25 lbs. Gator Bait San Pedro 4 Grouper 3 Yellowtail 1 Rosie Conie, Hill Billy Yacht 3 Yellowtail 20 lbs. plus and 1 Pinto- Perry Dize San Pedro 3 Yellowtail 1 Grouper and a limit of Goldies. Crapshooter Turner very slow, Loco Perro Willard bottom fish water temp 55 degrees, Rock and Rell Turner limit of Goldies, Hanna Ryan 14 mile reef limits of nice size Rock Bass.

**3/19** Jayhawker San Pedro 8 Yellowtail 20 lbs plus, GatorBait San Pedro slow, Fishfinder Willard some bottom fish but slow, Tzi Gane 14 mile limits of big Rock Bass, Last One 14 mile Limits of big Rock bass and 2 Pinto.

**3/20** Sand Dollar 14 mile slow on Rock Bass, Poco Feliz 14 mile slow on Rock Bass 1 Pinto. Perry Dize San Pedro 2 Yellowtail ( one weighed 27.4 lbs), WetWilly San Pedro 6 Yellowtail nice size and a limit of Goldies, Redrover San Pedro everyone on the boat caught their limit of big Yellowtail.

**3/21** 3 boats went to San Pedro and reported the catching slow to non-existent. Fishfinder went to 14 mile reef and brought home a box full of nice Rock Bass and 1 Puffer fish.
