Many of you reading this column attended the annual membership meeting on February 12th. For those who did not, we achieved a milestone with the report of the Charter and Bylaws Revision Committee. **WE HAVE A REVISED CHARTER!** It doesn't replace the original charter, just amends it. There were many problems with the existing charter. Prior board members, going back to the founders, were not legal under Mexican law. Therefore, we had no legal representative and could

not have defended a law suit had we been sued. Also, there were major banking issues. In addition to correcting these problems we can now amend our charter by 2/3 vote at annual meetings. We are able to own land, improvements, and personal property. We have a new mission statement that more accurately describes the activities we actually promote. **We all owe a huge thank** you to Don Webb chairman, Barry Bennington, Howard Powers and Duke Aiken for a job well done. They are now turning their efforts to Bylaws revision.

Two other "special purpose" committees are approaching their goals. The Policy and Procedures Committee, made up of Terri Overcast, Dan Salmen and Bill Stern, is busy updating a long needed manual. Anne DeFrance, with a lot of help from Carolyn Kinsman and others, is putting the final touches on a new written presentation to be used to promote Club Deportivo and our US charitable foundation The Club Deportivo Foundation, Inc.

## DID YOU KNOW:

The old saying, " wind in the East, fish bite the least " Like many proverbs, this one is generally true. But it's not necessarily the wind that affects the fish bite. It's the weather that accompanies the wind,such as Barometric pressure and storm conditions. To carry what Don has here one step farther is the old adage: "Red sky in morning sailors' take warning. Red sky at night sailors' delight". The red sky at night indicates high pressure and stable air coming in from the west. The morning red sky means a high water content in the atmosphere and a storm may be moving to the east. Thus changes in barometric pressure. One additional tid-bit of information the saying originated in Medieval England and is attributed to shepherds not sailors.



**Summary of the meeting with  
Mexican Immigration Authorities  
at Club Deportivo of Bahia de Kinon February 9, 2011**

**Forma Migratoria  
Múltiple (FMM)  
(Basic Tourist Visa)**

To be used by persons who plan to stay no more than 180 days:

- Tourists
- Businesspeople
- Travelers crossing the border in route from one country to another
- Representatives of cultural and religious organizations
- Distinguished visitors
- Students
- Press correspondents

This is a paper form which you fill out upon entering the country; the immigration office maintains one part of the form and give you the other, which you must turn in upon leaving the country.

**CONDITIONS:**

- Persons staying no more than seven days do not need to pay the fee.
- The 180 days must be used consecutively. They are not cumulative, i.e., you cannot go out and come back, using 60 days now, 40 days later, etc., for example. Any time you leave Mexico, you must turn in your current FMM; and to come back into Mexico, you must get a NEW one.
- If you stay the full 180 days, you must leave Mexico for at least one day, after which time you can come back in and get a new FMM for another 180 days.
- It is your responsibility when you leave the country to turn in the FMM to the Immigration office where you are crossing the border. If you do not turn this in, it could cause you problems when you attempt to return and acquire a new FMM, making you subject to a fine.

**Forma de No Inmigrante  
(Formerly FM3)**

To be used by non-immigrant foreigners who plan to stay in the country more than 180 days.

**CONDITIONS:**

- You may apply for this type of document at Mexican Consulates or Embassies, or you may apply online at [www.inami.gob.mx](http://www.inami.gob.mx). You also may visit the local Immigration office for information and assistance.
- This document is valid for one year and must be renewed annually. Allowing this document to expire will result in fines when you attempt to renew it.
- You may renew this document as many times as you chose; but if you decide to reside more permanently in Mexico, you may want to consider switching to the Forma de Inmigrante (formerly FM2).
- You may have a Forma de No Inmigrante that allows you to do some kind of business, or you may have one the does NOT allow you to do business, depending on how you state your intentions.
- Currently you are asked to check out of Mexico when you leave, and to fill out an FMM (tourist visa form) when you return. This has nothing to do with your legal status, does not mean you are considered a tourist, and you will not be required to pay the fee. It is a statistical procedure that alerts the Mexican government to your whereabouts and eventually will be replaced with the use of proper electronic scanning and recording devices at border crossing offices.

**Forma de Inmigrante  
(Formerly FM2)**

To be used by non-immigrant foreigners who plan to stay in the country permanently. After five years, it make you eligible to apply for Mexican Citizenship.

**CONDITIONS:**

- You may apply for this type of document at Mexican Consulates or Embassies in the US or Canada, or you may apply online at [www.inami.gob.mx](http://www.inami.gob.mx). You also may visit the local Immigration office for information and assistance.
- This document is valid for one year and must be renewed annually.
- You do not have to have had a Forma de No Inmigrante (FM3) before applying for the Forma de Inmigrante (FM2); you may apply directly for the Forma de Inmigrante.
- You may have a Forma de Inmigrante that allows you to do some kind of business, or you may have one the does NOT allow you to do business, depending on how you state your intentions.
- Currently you are asked to check out of Mexico when you leave and to fill out an FMM (tourist visa form) when you return. This has nothing to do with your legal status, does not mean you are considered a tourist, and you will not be required to pay the fee. It is a statistical procedure that eventually will be replaced when proper electronic scanning and recording devices are available at border crossing offices.
- \* You may begin this application process with the Ministry of Foreign Relations after having a valid Forma de Inmigrante for two years.

## GENERAL:

When you apply for a visa or resident permit, you should be very clear about your intentions:

1. Do you intend just visit?
2. Do you plan to stay for more than 180 days?
3. Do own or plan to own property?
4. Do you intend to do business of any kind, or do you want to leave the door open to the possibility of doing business?

If you explain clearly what you intend to do, the Immigration officials can help you decide which kind of visa is appropriate for you.

It makes no difference to Mexican Immigration which of these visas you have if you own property in Mexico. There MAY BE tax

implications, however, and you should consult with your Mexican Lawyer and/or Notary about this.

**These procedures are new;** their implementation is not quite a year old yet. The Immigration Officials willingly admit that the systems to properly enforce all the regulations are not yet in place. Therefore, when they tell you that you need to check out and in when leaving and coming back into Mexico, they admit that they do not have all the means to enforce that as a regulation. However, they ask your cooperation and emphasize that compliance is in your best interest because it is the only way Mexico knows if you are inside or outside the country. In most cases, this would not be a problem;

but if you experience some emergency -- accident, criminal violation, robbery or loss, for example, and you are not properly recorded as being in or out of Mexico, it could lead to legal problems and perhaps jeopardize your legal status here.

## CIMA Hospital Summary of his visit

1. Since MEDICARE does NOT pay for care performed outside the US, **it is important to have supplemental coverage.** Please check and make sure you know where your supplemental insurance information is. Insurance card, member number, telephone numbers, etc. Do you have a copy of the policy? Please ensure that at least one other person knows where your information is in the event something happens and you are not able to provide your information. To the extent possible, make sure this information comes with you to the hospital even when it is an emergency and you come by ambulance.

2. **Please confirm your coverage amounts with your insurance carrier.** This means calling them

and asking specific questions. Most important question is on coverage limits and location of service. If your policy limits you to a certain dollar amount per episode or per lifetime, please make sure you understand how much coverage is left on the policy. CIMA can do this for you if you provide us with the information. Please confirm that you are covered for both emergency and non emergency episodes of care while living outside the United States. Many carriers will only cover emergency services outside the US without pre authorization.

3. **Confirm with your carrier whether they will allow CIMA to bill them directly** OR will you have to pay CIMA and then file for reimbursement from your carrier.







































































4. **Please confirm how they will reimburse physician fees.** Will the same process apply?

5. **In the event the carrier will not allow CIMA to bill directly, then please be prepared to make the necessary deposit upon being admitted to CIMA.** This varies according to the procedure or surgery being performed. If it is elective surgery CIMA can provide a fairly accurate estimate of what anticipated charges are going to be, including physician fees.





6. If you do not have US/Canadian coverage outside the country, CIMA strongly recommends purchasing coverage from a Mexican Insurance company. Information on options is available at CIMA.
