### Rescue One Etiquette

I wish to address the use of **channel 24**. As you may know, last year, things had become somewhat lax.

**When calling on channel 24**, always give the name of the party being called two times and then identify yourself. Upon response, immediately suggest another channel, usually 12 or 14, and go to

that channel. Chit-chat should not occur on channel 24.

**Example call:** Sand Dollar, Sand Dollar, come back to Running Rebel.  
**Reply:** This is Running Rebel. Go to channel 12.

**A special time has been set up each day for Community and Club announcements.** All announcements should be given at this time, and all other non-emergency announcements should be

held to an absolute minimum throughout the day.

**Rescue One is available to help all people in our community.** Please contact them for any needed information. If they do not have the answer immediately, they will help you to know the best thing to be done.

**We all need and want to use channel 24; let's all try to do it properly.**

## Anthony Zepeda, 1950 - 2011

In August of this year, Anthony (Tony) Zepeda Ortíz, Manager of Club Deportivo from 1985 until his retirement in 2010, passed away. The following article is rewritten from an article printed in the November 2005 issue of the Knews.

Try to imagine dealing with the Mexican government's requirements for a non-profit organization while balancing the wants and wishes of over 200 club members, from several different countries, with widely varying priorities and points of view, and keeping an organization financially healthy and functioning seven days a week.

That's what Tony Zepeda did — and more — for 25 years. Born José Antonio Zepeda Ortíz on August 3, 1950, in Hermosillo, Sonora, Tony was the oldest of six children.

While a student, Tony worked to put his four sisters through business school. Tony's father worked for Fausto Garcia at the time; so while studying to be an accountant, Tony began doing various errands and jobs for Fausto; but he quickly moved up, and for several years was the purchasing officer for Garcia in the heavy equipment department.

But, like many young men, Tony had the urge to go north; so he

headed for California where he worked for five years in a restaurant, starting as a chef's helper, and eventually being given responsibility for the entire kitchen.

When he returned to Mexico in 1979, Tony again went to work for Fausto Garcia in an Hermosillo trailer park; then in October of 1981, Fausto sent him to manage the Kino Bay park. That's where he met Lupytha Ballesteros, who had been working as the receptionist for nearly a year. On December 12, 1982, Tony and Lupytha were married.

In May of 1985, Tony left his position with Fausto to look for another job. Lupytha was then pregnant and working for the Club Deportivo. When Ford Motor Company offered Tony a job and the opportunity to go to Japan for training, Lupytha gave two weeks notice that she would be leaving to go with him. The Club did not want her to leave, and they saw an opportunity. The person who had been managing the Club was leaving, so after a careful interview and review process, the Board offered Tony the position of manager. He accepted and began working on October 15, 1985. He and Lupytha stayed in Kino where they raised two daughters, Judith



Margarita and Lupytha. Tony was a proud and devoted father and always placed the welfare of his family above all else.

Whether in the kitchen for a Sunday morning breakfast, behind the bar for a Friday evening Social Hour, or keeping the place ship-shape for the many activities and events that take place at the Club throughout the season, Tony was always there as administrator, accountant, purchasing agent, negotiator, mediator, translator, enforcer, maintenance overseer, bartender, and great breakfast chef.

Thank you, Tony, for the many years you gave to Club Deportivo. You are remembered and will always be missed by your Club Deportivo friends and family.

Tony is survived by his wife Lupytha, his daughters Judith and Lupytha, and his beloved grandson.  
**Rest in Peace.**

## RECYCLING

The Ecology Clubs of Kino Bay are continuing their recycling program. As people are heading back to Kino, we want to remind you that the Club Deportivo is a drop off point for recycling.

**Club Deportivo has containers for:**

**newspapers, used batteries, aluminum cans & #1 (pete) clear plastic bottles.**

The students in the Ecology Club are collecting these items and recycling them. The **used batteries** are sent to Hermosillo to be disposed of with the City of Hermosillo's battery program. The Ecology clubs of Bahia de Kino & Calle 12 (Ponte las Pilas ecology club) have asked the authorities in Hermosillo for their own container to collect the batteries. The more we turn in to the clubs the more it shows the "powers to be" that a container is needed. The **newspapers** are shredded and mixed with concrete, sand & water and molded into building blocks. The **aluminum cans** are sold to a metal collector and the **plastic bottles** are sent to a recycling company and some are even used by the students to build fences and walls.

**REMEMBER TO SAVE THESE ITEMS AND DROP THEM OFF AT THE CLUB DEPORTIVO!**

There are other things you can do as individuals to help keep our beautiful beaches and community clean:

1. **Use re-usable shopping bags.** A huge source of trash is plastic shopping bags, flying around in the wind.
2. **Use biodegradable trash bags.** These are available at Sam's Club in bulk and at Wal-Mart in Hermosillo in smaller boxes located in the Houseware/storage areas on the wall. These bags break down in the landfill in 18-24 months instead of the 25+ years for the non-biodegradable Glad and Costco garbage bags.

## NEW EQUIPMENT FOR THE KINO RED CROSS

In April 2011, Kevin Morrisroe, Nancy Berg, Francine & Jim Bailey & Filiberto Vargas delivered some much needed equipment to the Kino Red Cross **on behalf of the Morrisroe family** at Condominios Jacquelyn.

Following Dorothy's death in November 2010 here in Kino, her family requested that donations to the Kino Red Cross be sent in lieu of flowers. The Red Cross in Kino gave us a list of needed items and they were purchased with the generous donations.

The **Ambulance in Kino** now has a state-of-the-art **Automatic Cardiac Defibrillator!** This is the same model that the Red Cross EMTs are trained on, so they all are certified to use it. In addition, we were able to provide:

- 2 high quality Stethoscopes
- 3 blood pressure cuffs
- 3 oxygen/pulse meters
- Small shop VAC for cleaning the ambulances
- VHF radio
- Handheld VHF
- Glucometer with supplies
- Pads for the defibrillator

The Ambulance Service/Red Cross staff were very appreciative of this equipment and the support of the American/Canadian community.

Kevin Morrisroe also has donated items to Club Deportivo's First Responders:

- 1 oxygen/pulse meter
- manual resuscitators with masks
- 4 curved forceps
- 4 bandage scissors

Everyone in Kino will benefit from these items.

Two hundred people, including 95 members of the Ecology Clubs in Kino Bay and 40 students from the Ponte las Pilas Ecology Club from the Calle Doce CBTA preparatory school, joined by fisherman, divers, teachers, NGOs, and local and federal authorities, participated in the October 2 beach cleanup project organized by our Kino kids as part of Ocean Conservancy's International Coastal Cleanup.

The morning started off at 8:00 on the pier in Old Kino, with speeches, songs, and kids from 6 to 18 sporting special T-shirts made for the event. From there, they tackled 5

kilometers of beach from Old Kino past the estuary with gloves and oversized trash bags.

The results? María Luisa (Marlu) Robledo Mejía, Coordinator of the Environmental Education program at the Prescott College Center for Cultural and Ecological Studies, says it was a SUCCESS!!

Because...

- It was organized by and for the ecology clubs, with a high level of organization and commitment from their community.
- It was more than a beach cleanup, it was an educational journey to learn together as a community... What kind of trash is in our beaches? Where does it come from? Who produced the trash?...and then to start to think how can we solve the problem.
- We have recorded every item found, giving us a clear picture of the manufactured items impacting the health of humans, wildlife, and economies in our community.
- We are being part of an

International effort sharing data with the world. The kids are learning to act locally and think globally.

- The kids are learning not just to clean the beach; they are learning to propose solutions involving the authorities and the community.

Marlu says they are nearly finished analyzing the data and will share that information when it is available.

**Now, as to the fishing report** for the last month, I only have a little general information to report since both Don and I returned only about a week ago and we missed a lot.

9/30 PERRY DIZE went to Cross Roads

for limits of dorado.

10/7 GATOR BAIT went to Turner for limits of sierra, bonito, and some yellowtail

10/14 PERRY DIZE fished at Deadman for limits of yellowtail and bonito

10/16 PERRY DIZE went to Deadman and Turner: limits on bonito and yellowtail

10/19 LAST JUAN went to Turner area: limits on yellowtail and bonito, also some sierra

10/21 GATOR BAIT and 13-0-13 went to Dead Man and Esteban caught good numbers of bonito and some yellowtail; NIGHTWINGS fished Dead Man and the south end of Turner for sierra and one decent bull dorado

NOTE: Jim Bailey deserves a special nod for his contributions to the nutritional health of the sea lions of Isla Esteban.

I know more boats were out there for the bonito and yellowtail bite, and assume they did well too. 
