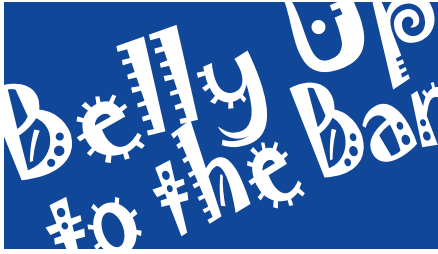

With the new season we will also see some new pricing which was necessary mainly due to continued increased pricing on products for the bar. New pricing will include:

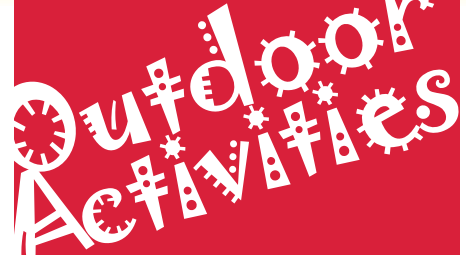

We will be taking school supplies out to the *ejidos* again when we return in the fall and continue to resupply them as long as school is in session thru the spring. Here is a list of what we take out: Backpacks, spiral notebooks,

pens, pencils and pencil sharpeners, scissors (the type that can be used by either right or left-handed folks), glue (either sticks or bottles), colored pencil pkgs., colored folders, pencil-top erasers or flat erasers, and rulers. I mention backpacks first because that's what the whole program revolves around, so make them the first priority.

In addition, teachers love for the younger students to receive coloring books, but please remember that if it's an activity-

type coloring book, it needs to be in Spanish. Those of you who live close to the border, or stop there on your way to Kino could help us with getting coloring books in Spanish. 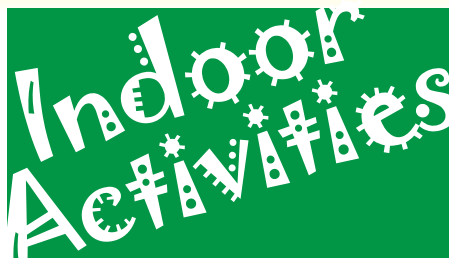

HEPATITIS IMMUNIZATION

Hepatitis immunization is now a combined shot for both Hepatitis A & B. You receive the first injection, then 1 month later you get the 2nd injection, and six months later, the third and final injection. After the final injection, you have lifetime immunity.

For the people returning to Kino this fall and planning to be there for six months or less, our advice is that they start the injections now while they are in the US, and time it so that they can receive their final injection when they return next spring. The local

Health Department or your family doctor is the best place to begin.

For those in Kino fulltime, Ricarda at Farmacia Aquaria can obtain the medicine, and you can go to the Clinic or the Red Cross for the injection if there isn't a medical person available in Kino Nuevo. For anyone living in Kino over the summer who would like to get started, call Carolyn Kinsman who can call Ricarda so the vaccine can be ordered.

Ann Gianinni emphasized that getting our community immunized would be the best thing we could do in memory of Gary. She says doctors in Phoenix told her he would be alive today if he had been immunized. —RV

- The board has submitted all the necessary paperwork to the Mexican Government to **renew the Club's land lease**. We have met with officials and are waiting for the final paperwork from the government.
- The board approved a **No Smoking Policy** for Breakfasts and Dinners. During Social Hour the tables by the entrance doors have ashtrays for smoking.
- We have a **WiFi connection** at the Club thanks to the generosity of Club member, Myron Joy. Donations will be necessary for usage to pay for the WiFi's monthly connection fee.
- The **hours** for Social Hour next season will be 5-7:30 p.m.

- The board found it necessary to raise the **dues for 2008** to \$75.00 per person per year. In Mexico, a cost of living (COLA) increase is published every January, reflecting the increased costs for labor, supplies, food, utilities, fuel, salaries, etc. The club's expenses rise accordingly. Yet, dues had not increased over the past four years. Secondly, funds are required to pay the salary for Summer Rescue One and to establish a contingency fund for the time when we will have to hire a full time Rescue One person. Finally, there are many deferred maintenance issues at the club which we are going to need to address in the near future. Raising dues is the best way to ensure that the entire membership fairly shares the cost of services the club provides.

Enclosed in this newsletter is a proxy for the annual meeting, which will take place Saturday, February 9, 2008, at 9:00 a.m. The following positions will be up for election: President, Second Vice-President, Secretary, and three Directorships.

Special thanks to Jamie Jerdee for giving so much of herself to Rescue One from October to the end of May, to Luytha Ballesteros for working Rescue One this year from June to the end of October, to Tony Zepeda and Omar for their continued good service, to the Officers and Board of Directors for giving of their time and themselves—more than any one realizes, and to all the club members who volunteer in many areas to help the club be so successful.
