Recently I was privileged to attend a meeting organized for the Kino area by the Sonora Tourism Department. I want to share the information covered with you.

- The road from Hermosillo will be completed to Kino -- it will not stop at 36th Street.
- The coastal road from El Golfo to Guaymas has been started but the exact route has not yet been determined. In other words, they do not know if the road will come through Kino Bay or be east of us. It will be several years in the making, and getting the right of way, etc., will decide the route.
- There are still discussions about putting a marina in at the north ramp but nothing concrete at this time.
- The federal government is planning to develop a ramp for pangas in Old Kino, along with a marine gas station and docking facilities. (This could be for pangas only.) Also, they envision small cafes along the water edge near the gas station and dock.
- They expressed pleasure that the free zone for motor vehicles is in place.
- The tourism department is very positive about the future of Bahia de Kino.

During the meeting, local restaurant vendors reported that liquor licenses are hard to come by and very expensive to get and keep. They also mentioned that liquor inspectors recently have fined some small Kino

restaurants and vendors without liquor licenses for allowing patrons to bring beer and other alcoholic beverages into their establishments. The fines were quite high. Please help spread the word. What the new "Free Zone" means is you don't have to have a vehicle permit to come to Kino or even down to Empalme. But, if you intend to go south of KM98 at Empalme (for example Alamos), you have to have gotten your permit way back up at KM21 or go back all the way to KM21. Permits are NOT yet available at KM98. So, until sometime next Spring, if you are planning on going south you will need a permit but will not be able to get it at KM98.

AND REMEMBER, visas are still required from KM21 south, no change there or in the REDLIGHT-GREENLIGHT Aduana rules. — JK

special sweet to bring with you if you can.

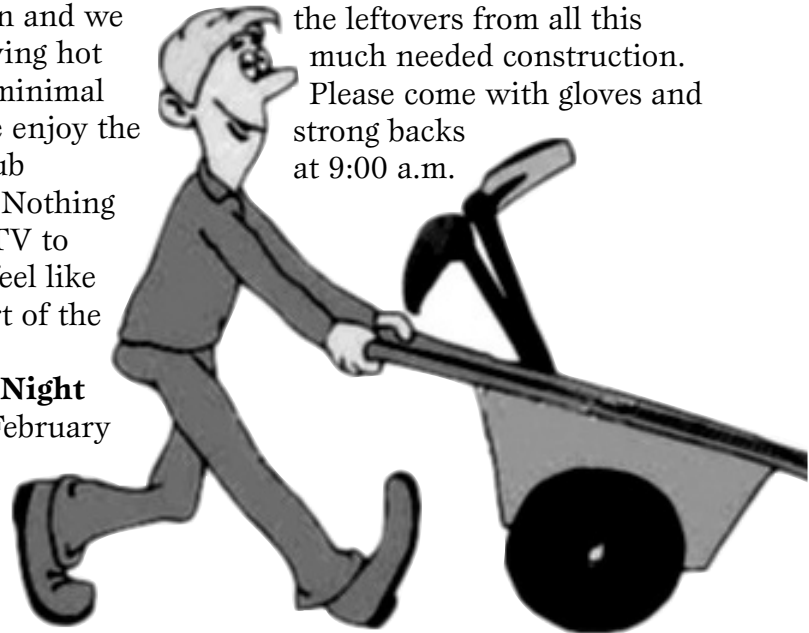
Coming in March, **Western Night** at the Club, March 10.

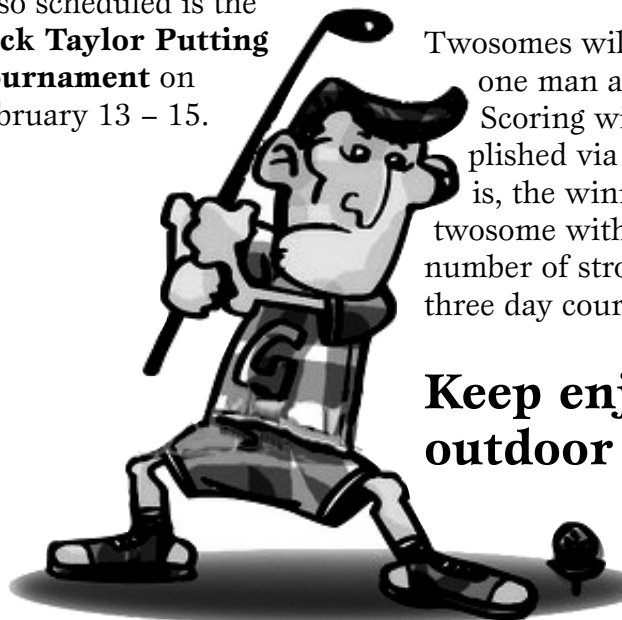

# REEL NEWS

This report covers the period December 20, 2005 through January 20, 2006.

The Northwest winds blew 19 days during this 32 day period. Fishing was almost non-existent during these days.

Many boats went out on the days they could, and brought home good eating bottom fish. The only significant fish that was reported to be caught during this period, was a 52 lb.

White Sea Bass. It was brought home by the "Ole Rip" boat on January 7th, and was caught at the 14 mile reef.

## Where did the Yellowtail go?

During the latter part of December, a few small yellowtail were caught near Barrel Point, when the water temperatures were running in the low 60s. Following this the water temperatures for most of our area dropped into the 50 degree range, and almost no yellowtail were caught. (One exception, was that on January 14, the "Happy Hooker" boat did catch an estimated 20-lb. yellowtail off the bottom, while fishing with bait.) For the most part, however, yellowtail fishing in our area was over. The good book shows that the water temperature range for catching yellowtail is 60 to 70 degrees, and that the optimum is 62 to 66 degrees. —DW
