## The Prez Sez...

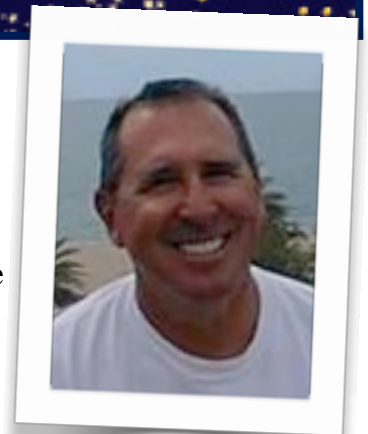

# FISHING REPORT

Mid Nov. – Mid Dec. 2008

**White Sea Bass:** The number of White Sea Bass being caught this year seems to be less than in past years. However, the overall size seems to be a bit larger. Very few fishing folks in our area have ever used live bait. Some of our White Sea Bass people are now fishing with live bait. They are using Mackerel, Sardines, or Grunts, and the Grunts seem to be the easier ones to find. The Burrito adult Grunt found in our area looks somewhat like a Perch or a Snapper, and is most often found near rocky shore lines. On Nov. 21st the Overcast boat caught a 30- and a 32-lb bass. On the 22nd the Bombero boat brought in a 51- and a 36-lb. bass. On this same day, Seri from the Red Lips boat, caught her first White Sea Bass, and it weighed about 42 lbs. On the 27th the Overcast boat caught a 46 lb'er.

**Yellowtail:** On Dec. 3rd and 5th, everyone on the Hillbilly Yacht and the Redrover boats caught their limits near San Esteban Island, and they weighed 17 to 29 lbs.



**Other Fish:** The captain of the Jayhawker boat, while fishing near San Esteban Island, hooked a Flounder and brought it up to the boat where everyone could see it, and it was estimated to weigh 12 -14 lbs. It got off his hook right at the boat. About an hour later he hooked a big Yellowtail and fought it up to the boat and his knot broke. It just wasn't the judge's day!

## Did you know?

Flounder are born like any normal fish—with eyes on each side of the head. In the larval stage, one of its eyes migrates toward the other eye until both eyes sit at the top of the head and on the same side. Most Pacific Flounder have their eyes on the right side of the head when looking from the tail towards the head. Left-eyed Pacific Flounder are very uncommon, and many anglers spend a lifetime without catching one.

I am certain that I have missed some good stories and have left out someone who had a good catch, but you have to let me know in order for it to get in the report. — DW

# CORROSION

**S**alt water and metals. The two never co-exist harmoniously, leading to a never ending battle to keep our homes, cars, and boats from returning to their elemental origins. Homes and associated ironwork benefit from timely and careful painting, but how do we protect metals, machinery, and electronics on boats?

I've used Fluid Film, a lanolin based product, with great success for several years. Spray cans of Fluid Film can be purchased at many John Deere dealers and, interestingly, over

the internet on e-Bay. Corrosion protection is vastly greater than products such as WD-40.

This past summer my wife and I attended the AEE air show in Oshkosh, Wisconsin and I was introduced to CORROSION-X. The literature and the salesman were both highly persuasive, so I tried a bit. This stuff really works! It comes in three forms, a lighter one for all around use, another grade heavier especially for firearms, and a heavier one especially for marine and similar

use. The material actually penetrates the pores of metals, displacing water and salt, keeping it out for extended periods of time. An absolute '100% money-back guarantee if not satisfied' speaks well for the integrity and confidence of the manufacturer. I was given a handful of small

sample tubes which I'd be happy to share on a first-call basis. I also have a spray can of the marine grade which you can see if interested, but it's all I have.

With either product, if there is sufficient interest among you readers, I'd be willing to investigate the purchase of a case while I'm in Tucson early February. Call if you are interested. 242-0881. — LJ
