A PLUMBING REMINDER!

Several Kino homes suffered water damage last year from failure of cheap water stops and flex tubes under sinks and toilets. They failed due to the creation of an electrical current between two dissimilar metals placed in an electrolyte (e.g. saltwater). Kino's city water is now very good, but it used to carry sufficient salt to create electrolysis, and if you've installed cheap pot-metal stops and supplies with a high zinc content, you'll likely suffer the fate experienced last year by at least six of your neighbors.

Several local home owners first heard of the problem via long-distance phone call from a friend who saw water pouring out from under their front door.

The supply tubes in question were installed in recent years, and are marked with a regular pattern of red and blue stripes. They fail after a year or two. The water stops are not as easily recognized, but they're the cheap ones seen over the past few years. The good brass ones cost about \$5 each.

If your home is new, replumbed, or remodeled in the last few years, this is a good time to take a look under sinks and behind toilets for those flex tubes with blue and red stripes, and get them replaced. Good quality flexible supply tubes are available from Home Depot, Ace, and Kuroda in Hermosillo. They're marked with a series of single black stripes; and when you pull on the connector nut, you'll clearly see a copper neck piece attached to the flexible tube.

KINO SUNSET

Fill a 16oz. glass with ice cubes. Add **1 shot clear Bacanora**, not the smokey kind (you can use tequila instead) and **1 shot Controy** orange liqueur. Fill to within 1/2" of top with a mixture of **1/2 fresh local orange juice** and **1/2 mango juice**. Add **juice of 1/2 lime** and a **dash of bitters**. Stir well. Pour in a healthy **splash of Grenadine** (that's the 'sunset' part). Drop **1/2 orange slice** down the middle. It will taste great after you finish the drink, and don't forget to invite us too!!!
