Kino Ladies Klub Scholarship Program Diane Ackerman, Chair

The KLK Scholarship Program is an outreach of support to provide monetary assistance for the education of students attending high school in Kino. When a qualifying student is awarded a KLK scholarship gift, there are two parameters that must be met to continue the next semester on scholarship: 1. Maintain an overall grade of 80%, or greater, for the semester 2. Work closely with a Classroom Teacher in one of the elementary schools to complete 3 hours of Peer Tutor Time each week assisting a student/s.

Each school year KLK awards a Maria Peral Memorial Scholarship to an outstanding incoming Sophomore student who qualifies for the gift in her honor. Maria, a Kino resident, was instrumental in establishing the high school in Bahia de Kino.

We are thrilled to announce that we had the funds to pay the 2016-2017 tuitions for 8 Seniors, 7 Juniors and 13 Sophomores. Three students are supported privately through the KLK program. The current tuition per semester is \$100 (US); \$130 (CAN) or peso equivalent which KLK is required to pay in advance.

We are welcoming donations, in any amount, to the KLK Scholarship Fund to continue supporting 25 students a year. We can assist you in finding a student if you would like to privately sponsor a specific student. 12/12 To Turner for nice yellowtail and two sardinera/brownies (one very nice).

12/13 To for 7 nice yellowtail.

12/15 To Turner, for 8 nice yellowtail.

12/23 To Turner for limits of yellowtail.

Most caught trolling with purple or silver X-Raps and a few jigging.

12/26 DAKOTA went to Turner for 10 yellowtail.

12/31 EL PATO Turner and Dead Man for limits of yellowtail and limits of goldies. DAKOTA got 14 yellowtail there also.

1/03 EL PATO to Turner for limits of goldies and one 20 pound white sea bass. It was generally a slow day unless you got to Deadman early and trolled. **DAKOTA** got 6 yellowtail, **SAND DOLLAR** got "a few" yellowtail, and **NIGHTWINGS** landed one nice yellowtail and had another break off on deep jigs, plus some bottom fish.

SEA SHELL caught limits of rockies and triggerfish near Punto Tie Hitt (the southeast corner of Tiburon).

1/09 DAKOTA fished Turner for 10 yellowtail.

1/12 DAKOTA went back to Turner for 3 yellowtail.

1/19 **DAKOTA** to Turner for 6 yellowtail.




The Ad-Hoc Committee agreed that the perception in the community is that the Meals Director is too much work for one person. Therefore, we recommend splitting the duties into three (3) positions as follows:

- 1. Meals Director: Responsible for all paperwork, preparing and posting a chart of meals: works with the Board of Directors to set meals dates: is responsible for flyers and advertising: writes newsletter articles and Board reports and attends Board meetings.
- 2. Kitchen Assistant: Oversees the kitchen, works directly with organizers and sponsors, and helps maximize ticket sales.
- 3. Kitchen Recruiter: procures organizers and sponsors: procures entertainment for dinners.
- 4. #1 would be the Director on the Board and the #2 & #3 reporting to the director.

FINANCIAL RESULTS

Club Activities and Financial Operations

For The 12 Months Ended December 31, 2016



Membership dues made up 57% of our receipts in 2016 at \$43,100 uso,

The Bar and Kitchen combined netted \$22,000

Insurance Commissions totaled \$9,400 uso, and the balance of our receipts came from the Storage Lot, Outdoor Activities, and Merchandise sales.

2016 was again a year with some Unusual Expenditures. These are projects or equipment expenses that are not recurring, and for 2016 added up to \$3,273 um.

General Operating Costs for 2018 were \$51,550 uso. This is the total cost of operating our Club. It is comprised of: payroll, utilities, taxes, general repairs and maintenance for upkeep of the building, legal, accounting and bank fees, Rescue One supplies, and office supplies.

\$3,200 uso was granted into the community based on requests approved by the 2~ Vice President.




A favorable exchange rate, combined with earlier payment of membership dues, sales of storage lot items, and higher insurance sales commissions allowed us to transfer \$18,138 uso to our General Reserve.

Our Club ended the year with \$118,223 uso in assets - \$108,000 uso in cash and bank accounts.


At the end of the year, \$3,413_{USD} was due from continuing donations to the Carpet Replacement Project.

Inventories totaled \$1,775 usp, and the balance of \$5,035 usp is made up of miscellaneous short term receivables.

Current liabilities at the end of the year (and paid in 2017) totaled \$8,400 uso.

Non-Current Liabilities, made up of Funds and Reserves payable in the more distant future totaled \$21,368 usp.

The balance in the General Reserve at the end of the year was \$88,455 uso.
