Making it easier to pay your dues

Dear Members,

Your Treasurer, Joan Fairweather, and I have been working for the past several months to make paying membership fees easier for you. Various options are available – Credit Cards, PayPal, direct Bill pay through your bank, but all these options attract various fees that are imposed on the Club, or in the case of direct Bill Pay, a more tedious bookkeeping procedure to the club at this time. Throughout the 2017/18 season, we will be implementing QuickBooks® which will replace our current bookkeeping system and Membership Data Base. QuickBooks® also offers payment alternatives which may work for us, and we will be investigating this option during the upcoming season, once our staff is comfortable with QuickBooks®.

Membership fees make up over 50% of our Net operating receipts, and our membership numbers remain static – yes we have some new members, but sadly we have lost some members. Knowing that we'll achieve that 50% figure early in the season assists our planning for the balance of the season.

This season, our membership fees are scheduled to be \$100.00 USD, but your board has agreed that early payments should be rewarded and for this upcoming season, if your 2017/18 fees are paid by January 1, 2018, the membership fee will remain the same as last season - \$96.00 USD.

Effective January 1, 2018, the 2017/18 fees will be \$100.00 USD. (Fees paid after February 15th will include a late payment fee.) Membership fees for 2017/18 must be paid prior to attending, or voting, at the Annual Meeting – Saturday, February 10, 2018.

There are a few options if you are not in Kino and would like to pay your dues early. You may mail a check directly to the Club, send it to **Club Deportivo, P. O. Box 1065, Green Valley, AZ 85614, OR** you may use your bill pay via your bank and **have your bank send the check to the above address. Be sure to put on the FOR line – Membership Fees for 2018.** Your check must be postmarked prior to January 1, 2018, for the \$96.00 USD rate to apply.

As always, we, the Board, appreciate your commitment to & participation at Club Deportivo.

Here's news from our community:

The Kino magic project which is being constructed on the east side of Old Kino seems to be coming along nicely. Although they had to down size the original project, the project includes several swimming pools, water play areas for children, many palapas, picnic areas and restrooms. Also they have built several buildings to accommodate concession stands. They have also cut a new road from the east side of Kino to the Kino Magic Project. They are also paving Tampico, the street from downtown Kino to the Kino Magic Site. Up to this point it is very impressive.

Currently, there is an abundance of work in Kino, other than the Kino Magic Project; there are several apartment

buildings and a lot of new homes under construction. This is good news for our local economy.

This is the time of the year for our **backpack program** where **Club Deportivo** gives backpacks filled with school supplies to the children at the local breakfast program, Desayunador, when the new school year starts. We do not have very many school supplies to fill the backpacks that we have. Therefore the majority of the backpacks will have little supplies or none. For those of you that are coming down we would appreciate you bringing school supplies and small gifts (toys for ages 3 – 15 girls and boys) that we use to give out each month to those children at the breakfast program who have birthdays.

School supplies needed: spiral notebooks, pencils, erasers, scissors, glue sticks, pens – red & blue, protractors, rulers, & crayons. Small gifts may include: yo-yo's, small cars, trucks, hair ribbons and clips, jump ropes, soccer balls, small dolls, etc. I thank you, the children thank you.

KLK (Kino Ladies Klub) Scholarship Program

This amazing program is currently paying for 30 high school students in Kino Viejo.

We are now accepting donations for the next semester. Because the peso to US dollar exchange rate keeps changing, the committee has decided to reduce the price of each scholarship that is paid in US funds. The cost to support one student for one semester will be \$100.00 US this year. However, this year the price for each student for one semester has increased from 1500 pesos to 1700 pesos.

If you are interested in paying for a specific student, we will find one for you or you can get the name of a student to us that you want to support. All students must fill out an application and be accepted by the committee by meeting two requirements. One, being a GPA of 80 or better and the second, be willing to donate 3 hours each week at one of the two elementary schools. Once a student is accepted into the program they will continue until graduation or until they fail to meet one or both of the requirements.

There is a new flyer available at the club explaining the details of the scholarship program. This program is run completely on donations, we accept donations in any amount. We look forward to hearing from you.
