Hello everybody, we are looking forward to your return to Kino.

We have had a very productive summer other than the rain. We have been able to do **a lot of work within the school systems in Old Kino.** For example, we have:

- replaced windows,
- serviced and repaired the air conditioning,
- repaired broken lighting systems,
- fixed broken toilets, installed toilet seats,
- repaired bathroom sinks,
- installed water pumps,
- supplied picnic tables, and a many other general maintenance needs. In the next several weeks we will continue doing other repairs on the schools and playgrounds. Aside from the repairs we have also have had the opportunity to provide a fax machine, a ping pong table and an exercise bicycle from the members of our community. Thank you all.

In addition to the school repairs we have been **able to provide materials to the Red Cross** for their addition, and have made repairs at the breakfast club. As for the AA center we fumigated complete properties, several times, and with the help of the escapee's provided them with a new air conditioning system.

Additionally, we have been able to fulfill the majority of the request for assistance in the community.

The clinic in old Kino is undergoing remodeling and they are building several extensions to the clinic. This is going to be a great asset to the community. At this time it is unclear if one of the additions is to be used for X-ray equipment. We will update you when we have more information.

Lastly, we are in great need of backpacks, school supplies, and birthday gifts for children. We still have an abundance of stuffed animals, but are in need of toys.

Kino Ladies Klub (KLK) Scholarship Program.

This amazing program is once again supporting high school students in Kino to stay in school. This school year, we have **32 students on the program**. We will have 10 seniors, 12 juniors and 10 sophomores. Six of these students are being privately sponsored which means 6 families have specific students they want to financially support through our program.

In return for this gift of education, the students are required to donate 3 hours of their time each week at one of the two elementary schools working with teachers and younger children. Their grades are monitored and they must have a GPA of 75% or better to remain on the program.

This program is run completely on donations and all money donated goes directly to the school.

If you would like to give the gift of education, the cost is only \$120.00 (US) for one student for one semester or \$240.00 (US) for one school year. We accept donations (US or Canadian dollars or pesos), in any amount. FOR OUR FISHERMEN

Information from Bill Berg

There is a new mobile application, in which the Mexican government hopes to make simpler for visitors to engage in sport fishing in Mexico. Officials in Mexico City and San Diego, CA, have launched an application called — **Sportfishing México** — to connect fishermen and boaters to the website of Conapesca, the National Aquaculture and Fishing Commission.

This is intended primarily for United States visitors heading south to fish, the application provides a connection to the Conapesca website: **www.sportfishingmexico.com.** There, anglers will find vessel requirements, information regarding fishing permits and immigration documents, bag limits and other details, in both Spanish and English.

A sport fishing manual, Visit Mexico brochure, a directory of marinas and quick guide to sport fishing in Mexico are also documents that can be downloaded from the app.

Currently it is available only for Android devices, with an iOS version on the way.

An opinion letter from one of our members:

"Come on Man"

An open letter by Philip R. Williams, "Felipe"

To the Club Deportivo membership as well as full time or seasonal Kino Bay Residents:

Many of us have been visiting Kino Bay for many years; my first experiences in Kino were in the late sixties....seems like an eternity. Old Kino had no paved roads and it was obviously a fraction of its current size. New Kino had few homes on the beach the Posada Del Mar Hotel was very nice and the Kino Bay RV Park was (and still is) a happening place.

Now we have many beachfront homes approaching \$ 1 million dollars as well as a newer development - Kino Bay Estates. What is the attraction to Kino? Is it its quaintness, friendly people, sense of community and laid back lifestyle?

For most of us it is all the above, but it is the beautiful Sea of Cortez that draws us the most. I understand that the Club Deportivo too many is a social club but its roots were founded on sport fishing and safety – Recue One. Have you ever talked to the old timers about fishing 25, 30 or even more years ago? My Dad was one of those old timers. They all say one thing in common; the quantities and size of fish were much greater in years past.

It is all part of a global overfishing phenomenon which includes the Sea of Cortez. Fish populations have declined, big fish are gone. Big Marlins, Sail Fish,

Sharks, Sea Turtles, Mahi-Mahi (Dorado) and Yellow Tail are all on the decline, not extinct but on the decline. At one time turtles were plentiful, unfortunately the desire for turtle meat sent populations plummeting, the fins on sharks are their doom, shark fins bring up to 80 percent more than the shark meat – most are caught for the fins only. Enforceent....do we need the Mexican Government to tell us what is right or can we use common sense?

For certain a lot of the blame falls on the local Mexican fisherman, but keep in mind they are fishing to feed their families. We fish for the sport and to enjoy the Sea of Cortez. Is it sport to catch 50 plus (I have heard 91) Yellow Tail in the 10 pound range? Or land and bring in a 45 pound Marlin? Do not think for a minute that the locals are not aware of our "sport" fishing practices. And please do not justify overfishing by giving fish to those in need; it's a bigger picture than that. If your boat catches 12 nice fish how about keeping 4 or 5 and giving the balance to those in need. Instead of using a gaff use a net to "catch and release". We can still enjoy the Sea of Cortez including sport fishing while at the same time know that we are preserving and protecting it well into the future.

I know that many of you agree with my statements and I am thankful; for those that do not, please consider the result of your actions before it is too late.
