Unfortunately the Covid issues are still a major concern in Kino. But the increased availability of the vaccines gives us all hope for a return to normal times.

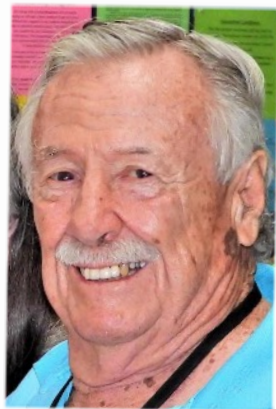

A message from your Staff...

Last season was a very trying season at Club Deportivo. Not only for business but for the social lives and Club interactions of those who were able to make it down to Kino. With constant, sudden, and ever-changing restrictions—depending on the contagion alert color system and tough Sonora state laws—we had to get creative to continue doing business. We are fortunate to have dedicated members who, near and far, continued to pay dues and help the Club with their donations. We are grateful to those who volunteered and put their time and effort into every fundraising activity, including our very own staff take-out burrito lunch.

A large part of a successful season, of course, is our income from annual dues. We wish to see everyone here with us; but if for any reason you are still not able to join us in Kino, we appreciate your support by sending us your dues via a check in the mail, PayPal, or calling in with a credit or debit card. Remember that a percentage of the dues we receive goes directly to the Charitable Giving Committee to continue with our age-old tradition of helping the less fortunate in our community. This year in particular, we have witnessed an increased need for help, both for medicine and to supply oxygen. Until now, we have not had much rain in Kino; but heavy rainfall is predicted for the rest of August and September, and this will result in increasing requests for assistance from the neediest.

Every summer, the staff works on maintenance and repair at the Club. This year is no exception, with over 121 projects on our list, ranging from the regular landscaping, to waterproofing, total rebuild of library palapa, and others. Taking a two-day break to get our Covid19 vaccine last month.

With vaccinations now available and continuing at a steady pace for all age groups, we are hopeful that this fall will be better for business, with fewer restrictions. However, the threat of Covid19 and the new variants is still present, and—as we have witnessed—the State of Sonora is firm on health and safety restrictions and will most likely still enforce these to some extent. We are hopeful that these restrictions will not be as tough, but we must keep in mind that for some time to come, prevention protocols will be a part of our regular operation. We must continue to be creative in our planning of events and meals in order to have a successful 2021-2022 season and, *most importantly*, we count on you being with us!

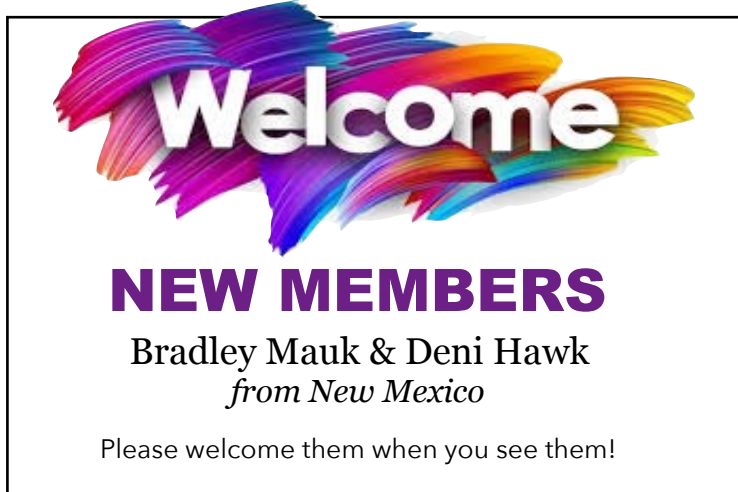
Hi everyone!

October 1st 2021 is the first day of the Fiscal 2022 season. As we put Fiscal 2021 behind us (the further the better!) we need to turn our focus to getting back on track financially,

returning to activities, functions, and meals that will put some pesos into the coffers.

Thanks to the great job done by the FUNdraising Committee, Pot O' Gold, combined with some generous donations, and proceeds from events that could be held, stability of the General Reserve is intact for now. This, combined with members keeping their annual membership dues current (even if they couldn't get to Kino for the season), and those purchasing insurance from Don Smith, will help push us through this financially trying season, setting us up to get rolling into Fiscal 2022.

We continue to struggle with declining membership numbers. Annual paid membership for Fiscal 2021 is 12% less than at the same time last year in Fiscal 2020 (at June 30th). This amounts to almost \$4,000.00 USD in fees alone that we've lost. On top of that - this means fewer members purchasing meals, bar drinks, and insurance.

This declining membership is not just a Staff and Board issue - it's an issue affecting all members. Should expenditures continue to be more than incoming receipts, eventually, the Piggy Bank (aka General Reserve) will be empty.

Members, serving on committees, and staff have been working diligently to come up with ways to increase membership while at the same time decreasing expenditures and working under the restrictions of the Charter and Covid regulations. These initiatives need to continue into the upcoming season, and they need your input. Put your thinking caps on and send along your ideas to the Staff or Board. Better still, attend a Board meeting. Hopefully by November, Covid regulations will allow membership attendance at Board meetings again.

I look forward to being back in the fall, and seeing you all back too. It has been a long Covid winter. We need to put this difficult season behind us, and move forward into Fiscal 2022.

We are holding the rate at the current year's fee of \$110.00 USD (or 1,980 pesos MEX) if paid by December 31, 2021.

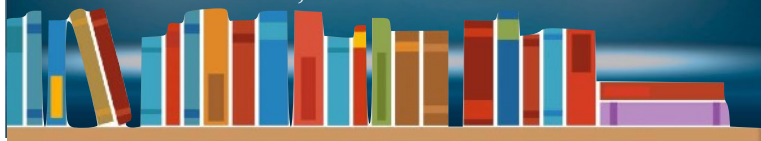
