Proper VHF radio procedures

or the lack of a technical term, I'm going to call this "calling in the blind". This past couple of months I have heard several people calling Rescue One, Rafael, or just a general call. They are calling without establishing contact. In other words, they are calling another station (Person) and assuming the other station is receiving them. By this I mean that they are just calling and giving the station they are calling the information they want to transmit without ever knowing if they have actually contacted that station.

Proper VHF radio procedure is to establish contact with the station you are calling before you give the information you want to transmit.

Channel 26 is a calling and emergency channel only. This channel is to be used for calling, checking in and out for the boats or land vehicles, and general club announcements. If you have other business, call first on 26 to establish contact, then go to a working channel.



SPEAKING OF MEMBERSHIP...

'Tis the season again! And with the new season comes dues payment. Membership year runs from January 1 to December 31. Annual dues of \$110/person are payable January 1. As of February 1, they will incur a late fee and be \$120/person. However, you are welcome to pay your dues any time before January 1.

As you get ready to pay your dues, please keep in mind the following key facts:

- 1. You must be an active Club member to attend a Club function or use the courts and library. (Active member is defined as either full year or temporary member.) An unpaid spouse of a member is NOT considered an "active member."

Note: Missing dates normally mean that the wind contributed to boats not going out to fish, or that no one replied to my requests.

Please send me any fishing news or pictures (especially): lyncurt0@gmail.com. If you can send reports by the 24th of the month, they have a better chance of being added in for the next report.

In general, the Bonito and Yellowtail are still biting greedily and most fisher persons trolling are catching limits plus. Little else, other than plentiful "Goldies" has been reported to me. Dead Man seems to be the most dependable location, with the south reef of Turner number two.

10/29/21 EL PATO fished Turner and Dead Man for limits of Bonito and Yellowtail in addition to bottom fishing for "Rockies" (Spotted Bay Bass). EL SUENO reported the same at the Turner area. Both GATOR BAIT and HILL BILLY YACHT actually went to Esteban for its limits of Bonito and Yellowtail trolling. ESCAPE fished San Pedro Matir for big Goldies and bottom fish, including two nice "Baquetas" AKA brown Groupers, between 25 and 35 pounds. NIGHTWINGS caught limits of Bonito and two Yellowtail and Dead Man, and two Pinto Bass (Pinta) and bottom fish including one Goldie over 6 pounds while jigging with squid bait at Colorado Risco. There were a couple of hungry sea lions (lobos) at Dead Man, and the bites did tend to stop in late morning at all locations.

11/01/21 GATOR BAIT and caught limits of Bonito at Isla Turner while trolling.

11/02/21 HILL BILLY YACHT and GATOR BAIT caught limits of Bonito at Isla Turner while trolling.

11/04/21 WET WILLY caught limits of Bonito and Yellowtail at Turner (?) and 2 Sardinera (Leopard Grouper/Brownie).

11/05/21 DAKOTA trolled for limits of Bonito and Yellowtail at Turner.

11/06/21 GATOR BAIT, LA DONNA, fished the Turner/Dead Man area for limits of Yellowtail and Bonito and bottom fished for limits of Goldies.

11/08/21 SAND DOLLAR trolled up Bonito and Yellowtail at Turner and Goldies bottom fishing.

11/13/21 SAND DOLLAR caught more Yellowtail and Bonito at Turner and Goldies and Scorpion fish on the bottom.

11/14/21 SAND DOLLAR still on the Bonito, Yellowtail, and Goldies at same location.

11/18/21 NIGHTWINGS fished the beach at Christmas Tree and the point at Estero Santa Rosa for four decent Cortez Halibut.

11/19/21 HILL BILLY YACHT caught limits of Bonito and 2 Yellowtail at Dead Man and LA DONNA caught limits of Bonita at Turner area.

11/20/21 EL SUENO caught Bonito and Yellowtail near Turner.

11/20/21 FOR PLAY went to Turner area for limits of Bonito and two small Yellowtail.

11/22/21 GATOR BAIT (on tour) caught 2 Striped Marlin, 14 Dorado, and a Rooster Fish while fishing out of Cabo San Lucas.

11/25/21 NIGHTWINGS fished the beach at Christmas Tree but only saw a couple of small "Sandies." We also confirmed rumors of the presence of a plague of "Jejenes" or "No-See-ums." Repellent helps a little, a fresh breeze does a lot more. Also found some interesting "markings" on the beach leading from the water.

W ith the Spanish and Catholicism, came Christmas, which has evolved over centuries into the unique traditions of Christmas in Mexico today.

In Mexico, people celebrate Christmas from December 12 to January 6, with an extra holiday on February 2.

From December 16 to 24, LAS POSADAS finds children carrying candles as they walk from house to house singing and asking for shelter. POSADA means inn or lodging, so this tradition represents Mary and Joseph searching for shelter in the biblical Christmas story. On each night of the Posadas, a different family holds a party with food, drinks, and music.



Another classic custom is *LAS PASTORELAS*. These are plays depicting the shepards' journey following the Star of Bethlehem to find the biblical nativity.

Christmas Eve is the main event in Mexico. Known as *NOCHE BUENA*, it is when most families come together to celebrate. Many families attend a special mass at midnight known as MISA de GALLO.

On Christmas Day, people continue feasting but are often too tired to do much else!

December 28 is the celebration of *LOS SANTOS INOCENTES*, honoring the babies King Herod ordered killed in his attempts to kill the baby Jesus.

January 6 is DIA DE LOS REYES (Three Kings Day.

This day is one of the most popular traditions in Mexico, and it is celebrated with an oval shaped bread covered in fruits, with a small baby figurine inside. The bread is called *ROSCA de*



REYES. Whoever gets the small plastic baby in their slice of bread is required to throw a tamale party on February 2!!!

February 2 marks the end of the Mexican Christmas season. This day is called *LA CANDELARIA* and is celebrated with lots of crazy parties to end the wonderful holiday season.


