# Membership

## GENERAL MEMBERSHIP

- \$100 plus a one-time initiation fee of \$10.
- May vote, have name published in the Club Directory, receive Newsletters and participate in all Club functions.
- May invite guests. Guests may participate in **two (2) activities per season, such as social hour, meals, games or sporting events.**
- May invite family members or friends (if their stay is limited to no more than two weeks per season) to participate in any two activities, as stated above, **as well as all meals and Friday social hours. ALL Guests must sign the Guest Book to not jeopardize our liquor license.**

## TEMPORARY MEMBERSHIP

- \$35 for Thirty (30) days per person.
- \$15 for Seven (7) days per person.
- May participate in all Club activities.
- **MAY NOT INVITE GUESTS to Club functions.**
- May not vote, receive the Newsletter nor have name published in the Directory.

## SUMMER MEMBERSHIP

- must be 18 years old.
- \$25 Dues per season.
- Term is May 1 through September 30.
- May invite guests (2) times during the summer term.
- May not vote, receive the Newsletter nor have name published in the Directory.

## INACTIVE MEMBERSHIP

- \$25 Annual Dues.
- May not participate in Club activities.
- May have their name published in the Club Directory.
- May receive mailed Newsletters twice per year.
- Must have been a regular member at some time.

## LIFETIME MEMBERSHIP

- Current and past Presidents, and their spouses; Founding Members and Endowment Members become Lifetime Members.
- Dues are waived in perpetuity and they are entitled to all Club benefits.

## HONORARY MEMBERSHIP

- May be offered in recognition of extraordinary service to the Club and/or the Kino Community; may be temporary or permanent.

## Let's talk about this Telephone List.



I have a NEW email if you can send me any fishing news or pictures: [lncurt0@gmail.com](mailto:lncurt0@gmail.com) If you can send reports by the 24th of the month, they have a better chance of being added in for the next report. Slow fishing days with few reports, although some have gone out. Either really too slow to report or keeping "secrets" – ha ha. In general, mostly bottom fishing occurring with any success.

**01/05** ROSIE boat went to Esteban for two "browns" (sardinera) on a slow day.

**01/10** ROSIE boat to Queen's Rock for eight browns, two yellowtail, then four goldies and one smallish grouper bottom fishing.

**01/11** NIGHTWINGS and ESCAPE crews to Christmas Tree shore fishing but only one small halibut and numerous goldies caught. Paul's cat was the only winner, but the weather was perfect. PERRYDIZE fished Turner for bottom fish.

**01/13** SAND DOLLAR at Turner for a yellowtail and goldies and rockies. HILL BILLY YACHT to Lorenzo bottom fishing with "no there there". Surface water at 59 degrees. Then to Esteban trolling in close for six brown fish.

**01/15** PERRYDIZE and SAND DOLLAR to Turner for bottom fish. HILL BILLY YACHT north of Willard for lots of goldies with some four to five pounds and limits of grouper/baquetas.



**01/18/19** "The south crew", (AKA GATOR BAIT) went out from Melaque/Barre Navidad for 4-5 dorado from 15 to 20 pounds and a 209 pound marlin.

**01/21** HILLBILLY YACHT to San Pedro Matir trolling in 62 degree water. Eight yellowtail with two in the 25 pound range.

**01/22.** "The south crew" caught a 20 pound yellow fin tuna and 40 pound sailfish (released) fishing out of Melaque again.

Pickleball

In accordance with our liquor license, the following is not permitted at the Club:

- No outside drinks may be brought in. If you would like a certain type of liquor at the bar, ask the Bar director.
  - Alcoholic drinks may NOT leave the building. This means that you cannot walk out with a bottle or cup.
  - Non-members present at an event must be signed in. Our license states that we may only sell alcohol to members. Signing the guest book makes you a member for the day.
  - Absolutely NO underage person may consume, buy nor hold alcohol. (The legal drinking age in Mexico is 18. If you have young guests who are at least 18, please make sure they carry an ID on them)
- Please help us obey the laws set by the State of Sonora and help us keep our bar open!
