RESCUE (**)NE

ALL ABOUT YOUR RADIO

This month I would like to talk about VHF radios and their use.

There are three very important controls on your VHF that need to be set properly for the unit to work. One important control is the squelch knob. This controls the sensitivity of the radio for "receive" only. Too low of a setting will result in not being able to hear a transmission, especially on channels other than 24. It is also a good way to set your volume. Turn the radio on and turn the squelch knob so you can hear static and adjust your volume to desired sound, then back off the squelch until static goes away. There is also a high/low switch. This changes the radio from 5 watts to 25 watts transmit power. This should be on high. The last important item is to hold the mike within one to two inches Continued on page 2

from your mouth and speak clearly into it. There is no adjustment for volume output on a VHF. The only adjustment is how loud and how close the mike is to your mouth.

When calling on the VHF, the proper way is to hail the person you are calling three times followed by your call name: for example, "Rescue One, Rescue One, Rescue One, your call name". Be sure that rescue one has answered before giving your information.

Be careful out there!!!

COMODATO COMMITTEE UPDATE

What's Happening with the Comodato and Plans for the Future of Club Deportivo?

ur committee continues to explore ways to ensure a secure future for Club Deportivo. First of all, let me say that the Club is not in danger. We are still under a valid Comodato for number of years. The challenge we face relates to the properties adjacent to the clubhouse site.

As we have reported, the State of Sonora has financial needs, and they are looking at the potential sale of "unused or underused" properties as a means of generating revenue. And while we may not agree with them, they see our parking and storage lot areas as being "underused." They have recently announced that they are offering such properties for sale a second time. They were unsuccessful the first time, perhaps because they are not particularly attractive properties for developers. Kino has no water, and many of the areas are extreme desert, far from the beach and access to utilities. However, they will continue to offer; and if the price is right, there is a chance they will sell.

Looking ahead, we feel that the most advantageous thing the Club could do would be to itself purchase the land.

I personally met on Tuesday, February 25, with Carmen Carballo, Director of Bienes y Concesiones (real estate and concessions) for the State of Sonora, and discussed with her a possible purchase of the land we occupy — what would be an acceptable price, and over how long a period of time. She was very

cordial and promised to give me an answer. I hope to have that answer soon.

In the meantime, the committee continues to explore other options, should purchase not be feasible. We well understand that the Club is experiencing a decrease in membership and that we do not have a lot of money to put into the effort. There is always the possibility of applying for a renewal of the Comodato; and if that happens, it will be essential for the Club to make some visible investment in developing the areas that appear to be underused, such as the addition of other facilities, then find ways to diversify and increase membership and create more income-generating activities. The Club is important to the entire Bahía de Kino community, and there are many more Kino residents who could and would make use of the Club, with appropriate schedule and activity adjustments.

The Committee will meet at 10:00 a.m. on Sunday, March 1; and a report from that meeting will be presented at the Board of Directors' meeting on Friday, March 13. If you have ideas you might like to share, feel free to speak with any of our Committee members:

01/25/20 HILLBILLY YACHT fished Isla

Angel de la Guardia for

goldies and five grouper including one 45 pounder Bagueta caught around 450 feet deep.

01/25 ROSIE went to Punta Willard for goldies and one small "Rosy Grouper" or Baqueta Rosa.

02/08 SAND DOLLAR trolled the Turner area with no luck with Yellowtail, but reported seeing fish "hanging" at depths below trolling range, possibly YT. Water temperature was 61 degrees. They then tried bottom fishing from Colorado Risco to Eagles Nest for a few Rockies and lots of nice Goldies in water from 140 to 180 feet.

02/12 JAYHAWKER did not have any success with trolling near Turner but did catch limits of Goldies, plus some Rockies and "Salmon". In fact they got some of the largest Goldies they have caught in a while, with one coming in at 6.3 pounds. They were hitting jigs, with or without bait.

02/16 SUN CHASER fished around Isla Turner but had no luck trolling.

02/17 SAND DOLLAR caught three decent Yellowtail near the light house Turner, trolling across the reef, then caught bottom fish in 61 degree water.


02/21 EL SUENO caught limits of Yellowtail near Dead Man and nice Goldies and Rockies near Colorado Risco in 150 feet of water. John Hazen was really lucky and caught a delicious 17+ pound Pinto Bass ("Pinta") on a Diamond Jig there. (Picture below) DAKOTA 2 boat went to Turner and caught near-

limits of nice Yellowtail

between Dead Man and Deep Reef as well as south of Turner.

The NIGHTWINGS crew fished the Christmas Tree beach at high tide and only caught a few small Rockies/Sandies and one small Mangrove Pargo. No Halibut, but really nice weather.


02/22/20 (Been



waiting to write that date) DAKOTA 2 went back to Turner for limits of very nice Yellowtail. The YT were hitting all colors and most have been using X-Rap 30s and a few 40s.

Earlier in week Report of a Mexican panga out south of Turner in deeper water getting a really big grouper, (a Baqueta Rosa). No picture, but worth mentioning.
