

All about the

he day is fast approaching for this One-Time-A-Year fund-raising event at Club Deportivo. **This year**, everything about the Club's one big annual fundraiser is different. Normally, the proceeds would benefit some 20 humanitarian programs in Kino AND Club Deportivo. This year, however, *all* proceeds will go into the Club's general fund to keep Club Deportivo strong and able to serve its members and the community for many years into the future.

Get tickets early:

Tickets are 100 pesos each and are on sale now, every Monday, Wednesday, and Friday from 9:30 a.m. until noon at Club Deportivo, under the Palapa. Health restrictions *may* limit number of tickets available, so get yours early!

Your ticket gets you into the event and a numbered bidding paddle for use during the live auction. A couple bidding together need two tickets, of course, but will get just one paddle. The number of your paddle will be used to keep your bar tab and any purchases you may make in the auction or from the sales tables.

This is an open event, and the public is invited. One does not need to be a Club member to participate.

The schedule:

The entry gate will open at 1:00 p.m. so that you can claim your bidding paddle, find a seat, order from the bar, visit the sale tables, and purchase 50/50 tickets.

The Auction:

Live Auction bidding will begin at 2:00 p.m. Around thirty fine items will be auctioned off, and we'll be using bidding paddles to keep track of bidders and bids.

Your winning bids will be kept on an "auction tab" for you, and you will pay at the end of the event. **PLEASE** come prepared to pay for anything you might win! Payment will be accepted in pesos or US dollars, or US or Mexican checks.

- Auction items will be on display, but photos and details for all items will be posted on the KBNet the week before the event so you can plan ahead what you want to bid on.
- You can participate in the auction event if you are not in Kino! If you can't be present, call a friend in Kino to serve as your "bidding buddy." Let your buddy know what items you want to bid on and set a maximum bid. Your buddy will be expected to pay for and retrieve any items you win at the end of the event, so plan for that.

Sales tables:

Items that in the past would have been in the Silent Auction will be priced and displayed on Sales

Tables. You will be able to browse the tables, tag what you will purchase, and its price will be added to your auction tab for payment at the end of the event.

Holding an event like this in the time of COVID is complicated, but we want to assure you that careful attention has gone into making it safe for everyone.

To be safe:

- Everyone will be required to wear facemasks and practice safe distancing.
- Chairs will be arranged in pairs or small groups, and spaced out for safety, with small tables for holding your drinks. No food will be served.
- Payment and money handling will be streamlined:

A bill will be kept, using your bidding paddle number, for any and all Auction items you win, plus any items you choose to purchase from the sales table; so you will pay ONE bill for them at the end of the event.

Waiters will take your drink orders, deliver your drinks, and keep a tab with your bidding paddle number. You will pay the tab at the end of the event.

Reporting Period: January 25 to February 22,2021.

Note: Missing dates normally mean that the wind contributed to boats not going out to fish. I have a NEW email if you can send me any fishing news or pictures: lyncurt0@gmail.com If you can send reports by the 23rd of the month, they have a better chance of being added in for the next report.

In general, it is still a slow period for most fisher-persons, with cold water temperatures down to 58 degrees and many breezy days. Yellowtail became very scarce around the midriff, but a few "toads" were caught, mainly around Isla Pedro Matir. Bottom fishing seemed to be the only sure bet, with some decent Goldies and "Rockies" caught. Many days there were boats out fishing but so little was caught that no one felt like sending in reports. Flounder continued to be scarce to nonexistent. No fresh reports from San Carlos either.

02/03/2021 SAND DOLLAR caught limits of Goldies at Turner. DAKOTA went to Pedro Martir and did well on Yellowtail. NIGHTWINGS made a trip to fish the beach around Santa Rosa and Christmas Tree, but nothing was biting and even clams were keeping a low profile.

02/07 GATORBAIT successfully fished Pedro Martir for 16 nice yellowtail and some Goldies.

02/10 PERRYDIZE went to Turner for a Yellowtail and bottom fish. SAND DOLLAR and GATORBAIT returned to Pedro and caught some Goldies, but the huge swells really made fishing nearly impossible. NIGHTWINGS tried trolling around birds at Dead Man and jigging for Yellowtail but only ended up catching some nice Rockies. The south end of

KINO LIMPIO y SEGURO KINO CLEAN AND SAFE

ave you perhaps noticed that there is less trash on the beach in Kino and along Mar de Cortéz? And what about that big yellow machine being pulled up the beach by a tractor? That's a huge "rake" that cleans debris from the sand as part of an effort to return our beaches to the pristine condition of years ago. Then there are the signs at all the beach entryways reminding visitors to recycle, deposit trash in the trash





cans or take it home with them, not drive vehicles on the beach, keep pets on leashes... And the workers with trash bags and grabbers, patrolling the beach and street early in the mornings, collecting trash and recyclable materials.

These things are happening due to a monumental effort initiated by a very energetic group of Kino homeowners and residents –spearheaded by Architect Gabriel Urquides, real estate agent Pati Armenta, and a few others, using WhatsApp on their cell phones to organize and push for change. **Kino Limpio y Seguro** started with a small group of concerned citizens and has grown to a subscription of over 200. A number of Club Deportivo members are enthusiastic subscribers. Most



of the postings are in Spanish, but you also see bilingual videos and information pieces.

There is no charge to join this group. However, it has substantial economic clout and has served as a vehicle to raise funds to:

- support Kino Bay's Office of Public Services with funds to buy paint and employ young people to paint speed bumps and eliminate graffiti,
- pay students to patrol the beach, educating visitors about recycling and regulations for using the beach,
- employ clean-up people to regularly do street and beach clean-up,
 - facilitate the purchase of trash cans and signs by businesses, organizations, and homeowners that now appear all along the beach,
 - purchase the beach cleaning machine and leaseto-purchase the tractor to pull it,
 - and more...all with individual donations.

No one has to donate a lot when there are so many involved, and these creative leaders make the pesos go a long ways.

Perhaps even more important than gathering monetary resources is their commitment to working with officials at the

local, state, and even federal level. They have done much to raise awareness of the needs of Kino and build alliances with the municipal government, especially the Public Services Division, in Hermosillo.

Kino Limpio y Segura has accomplished a huge amount since its creation just about a year ago,

even under pandemic conditions.

4:00 pm. With as many as six
dogs coming in for sterilization
surgery in a day, Ben Spade and
Juana Snippit have sometimes
worked well into the evenings

as volunteers in the clinic.

"It's all good," says Juana. "It's one small snip for each dog, but one giant leap for man's best friend! All these snips add up to fewer breeding dogs running around hot to trot in both

Old and New Kino."

"I'll second that!" says Ben. "Some days the kennels are stacked with doggies waiting for and recovering from surgery in the small space. It's a tiny clinic, but with professionals like Juana Snippet and Dee Knutter assisting Dr. Jose, these dogs are always in good hands."

These lucky dogs also receive rabies vaccinations and anti-parasite treatment. Speaking of vaccinations. Dee interjects, "On a serious note, we have

seen a few cases of Parvovirus come into the clinic. Pet owners should make sure their dogs are up to date with all vaccines. KBNSA never

In accordance with our liquor license, the following is not permitted at the Club:

- No outside drinks may be brought in. If you would like a certain type of liquor at the bar, ask the Bar Director.
- Alcoholic drinks may NOT leave the building. This means that you cannot walk out with a bottle or cup.
- Non-Members present at an event must be signed in. Our license states that we may only sell alcohol to Members. Signing the guest book makes you a Member for the Day.
- Absolutely NO underage person may consume, buy nor hold alcohol. (The legal drinking age in Mexico is 18. If you have young guests who are at least 18, please make sure they carry an ID on them)

Please help us obey the laws set by the State of Sonora and help us keep our bar open!
