


From Your President...

Looking Ahead to the Annual Meeting & Elections Saturday, February 12, 2022

A t Club Deportivo's Annual Meeting in February, which all members are encouraged to attend, the President will summarize the Club's activities and situation from the previous year, the Treasurer will discuss how we are faring financially, and other members of the Board of Directors will review their areas' activities over previous year.

With regard to the elections, board members are elected for two-year overlapping terms, and half of the positions are filled on alternating years. A sitting board member may choose to stay on for an additional term at the end of his/her two years, but members still may nominate other candidates for the position, and those nominee(s)' name(s) also will be on the ballot. Nominations from the floor are always permitted for the positions up for election in that year.

Brief descriptions of the **eleven** positions are:

President—Works with the Manager and Board of Directors to determine policy and ensure that the Club functions under the laws of Mexico.

First Vice President—Repsonsible for Rescue One and the First Responders; carries out the duties of the President in his/her absence.

Second Vice President—Oversees the Charitable Giving and Fundraising Committees; is liaison between the Club and the Mexican community.

Secretary—Records minutes of BOD's meetings; maintains records; distributes agenda items to Board members for meetings.

Treasurer—Maintains financial records for the Club; works with the staff to ensure good financial practices; analyzes and advises regarding safegarding the financial health of the Club.

Construction & Maintenance Director—Works with staff to maintain Club facilities in safe and stable physical condition; schedules maintenance, repairs, and improvements.

Library & Communications Director— Coordinates the Communications Team (Webmaster, Google Group Manager, Calendar

Coordinator, Weekly Schedule Publisher, and Newsletter Publisher); supervises the Librarian.

Club Deportivo abides by all clauses and ordinances contained in Law CLXXI of the government of the State of Sonora, which regulates COVID-19 safety measures, including, but not limited to:

- The use of facemasks is mandatory for all people within the territory of the State of Sonora and must be used inside establishments, whether of commerce, industry or services, work centers of any branch and shopping centers both essential and non-essential. A facemask must cover both mouth and nose.
- The use of face masks, as well as all other transmission prevention measures (safe distance, use of hand sanitizer and sanitizing mats) will be mandatory for as long as the health emergency remains and until the state authority officially declares the end of the pandemic and therefore the need for Law CLXXI.
- In the event that a person is not wearing a facemask, or is wearing that does not meet hygienic requirements, they should be asked to put on a mask or replace the mask with one that meets the requirements.
- Establishments must deny access to any persons not wearing a facemask and must inform the public that they will not be able to access nor be served until they are wearing one. Depending on the availability and financial capacity of the corresponding establishment, a free facemask may be provided.
- In all establishments, both employees and customers are required to wear facemasks that meet hygienic requirements. Upon entering, the establishment must have a sanitary filter and hand sanitizer, in addition to observing that a safe distance of at least 1.5 meters is kept at all times. Access should also be denied to people with symptoms associated with COVID-19 or whose body temperature is higher than 37.5 degrees Celsius.

Compliance with the provisions of this article, as well as any further measures that are mandated for this purpose or issued by the state or federal authority in the matter, will be a requirement for the issuance or endorsement of operating licenses to be authorized.

Please be advised that unvaccinated people may be inside this establishment at any given time.

HOW YOUR CHARITABLE GIVING WORKS

The Charitable Giving Committee recommends disbursement of funds from Charity accounts in collaboration with the Second VP and the Club Manager.

There are 3 main charitable funds or accounts. They are as follows:

- Board allocated funds which are generated from 10 percent of membership dues;
- A line item charity account which is raised from special events (The Benefit Dinner) and donations
- The 501 3c non-profit charitable foundation which holds funds for specific needs which are raised from individual donations

This past year there were no funds provided to the committee from the benefit dinner, but we did receive a donation from generous members. These donated funds were used primarily to provide food vouchers to members of the Kino community.

The board allocated funds for the past fiscal year totaled 59,027 pesos and were given to people of the community to help with medical tests, medication, food, gas/transportation, and medical oxygen. Prior to giving out this money, we try to ensure that all other means of help have been exhausted.

For this coming year, we have 4558 pesos to allocate for each month (54,697 pesos for the fiscal year beginning October 1. Again, these funds are allotted from your dues; so, thank you for being a member!

Welcome back to Bahia Kino and the real start of the fishing season. A lot of boats are ready or "near ready" to get out there fishing. In general, it sounds like the Bonito and Yellowtail have been cooperating around the Turner area, and timing is the key or secret, but I am not sure what that secret is at this time. There has been some good variety of catch also, with a few nice Sardinera/Leopard Grouper and even a Baja Grouper and an "early bird" White Sea Bass brought in. Trolling with X-Raps has worked best so far, with mixed color reports, such as pink, white with red lip, green and blue Mackerel, and blue and silver.

10/17 GATOR BAIT caught limits of Yellowtail and Bonito around Isla Turner.

10/19 HILLBILLY YACHT fished Turner for limits of Yellowtail and Bonito. EL PATO also fished around Turner for limits of Yellowtail and in deeper water for Goldies.

10/22 DAKOTA boat caught Yellowtail and Bonito around San Esteban in addition to two Baja Grouper and some nice Sardinera/Leopard Grouper/Brownies. Nice haul! ESCAPE was at Turner for limits of Yellowtail and a Grouper.

10/23 DAKOTA went to Turner for limits of Yellowtail. DOS PRIMOS and EL PATO caught Yellowtail and Bonito around Turner. GATOR BAIT did the same plus one Sardinera at Turner. EL SUENO fished Turner and the surrounding area for a mix of Yellowtail, Bonito, Sardinera/Leopard Grouper (around Dead Man) and one White Sea Bass south of Turner. They also fished deeper water for a catch of Goldies.

10/25 GATOR BAIT at Turner for limits of Yellowtail and Goldies, mostly at Dead Man. DOS PRIMOS at Turner area for Yellowtail, Rockies, Goldies and Bonito. ESCAPE was at Esteban for limits of Yellowtail and some Sardinera. SWELL DAZE at Esteban for Yellowtail. EL SUENO caught Yellowtail, Salmon, Pargo, and Goldies.

A KBNSA UPDATE

An Honest Look at What We Do

e at Kino Bay Neuter and Spay are in our 8th year of doing our best to reduce the unwanted dog litters in the Kino Bay Community. Since we began our program, over 1,000 dogs have



been sterilized. This year alone over 156 dogs have been neutered or spayed. We have been able to reduce the abandoned dog population and discarded puppy litters due to your contributions. Is our program perfect? No, although we do work to monitor and improve every year

— for each and every local dog that is in need.

Here are some good things about Dr. Jose's veterinarian practice:

- 1. Dr. Jose now has a professional scale to weigh the dogs before surgery.
- 2. He purchased an operating light.
- 3. He calls each dog owner the next day to check on the health of the dog.
- 4. He administers a rabies vaccination and gives the dog's owner a rabies tag and a certificate of injections with a vaccination schedule.
- 5. He charges our organization only \$35 USD for each neutered or spayed dog.
- 6. He now uses dissolving sutures on every dog that requires stitches.

The bad things? Two to three percent of Kino dogs die during or immediately after surgery. This breaks our hearts more than we can express. But many dogs come in malnourished with fleas and ticks or with other pre-existing conditions that are unknowable because of lack of laboratory and imaging services. But we know that Dr. Jose does the best he can to save every dog. A board member discusses every bad outcome with Dr. Jose and a personal call is made to the owner of the dog. That's truly the best we can do.

We know that what we do is important to the community, beneficial to the dogs and to their owners. Thanks for supporting this valuable service to Kino.
