For the first time in 3 years, we were able to add a few dollars to the General Reserve, even after we dealt with our staffing changes, and a few cancelled meals. As in Fiscal 2021, some donations toward meals, Rescue One, and summer projects were received to assist us, and by the end of the season, meal attendance was on its way up to pre-Covid levels. This momentum is continuing into our current season – Fiscal 2023. Operating expenditures were slightly less than receipts allowing us to add \$239.00 USD to the General Reserve.



We saw a slight improvement in Membership for Fiscal 2022, picking up 30 new members, but unfortunately losing 14.




We continue to struggle with membership, which of course affects all aspects of the Club operations. Less members at the bar, less meals sold, and less insurance commissions.

10/13-21/22 First, since fisher-persons are just really beginning to arrive in Kino, I will give a very general report on conditions and fishing from Kino. Water temperatures were slightly warm but when I checked with NOAA, the report said that the Sea of Cortez is entering an unusual triple La Nina this winter, which normally means cooler surface water. So something other than the typical El Niño Southern Oscillation is creating unusual sea surface warming, possibly, believe it or not, Global Warming. This is also causing long droughts in Sonora and the Southwest effecting the chili pepper crops and the food products related to them (AARP 11/22). Enough climatology here.

Trolling with X-Raps of all sizes from 25s to 40s has been producing good catches of Yellowtail and Bonito plus scattered Sierra. The only locations reporting catches include the light house area south of Turner, Dead Man and San Esteban (for larger bonito). There was also chatter on the radio of catching "just guppies", i.e. code for bigger fish possibly (?). Anyway, a number of boats were "out there" catching plenty of fish for canning and sashimi, including MAYFLOWER, GATOR BAIT, SANDDOLLAR, SHAMROCK, EL SUENO, and HILLBILLY YACHT. SAND DOLLAR had family out for excellent Goldie catches plus a one big Grouper, Yellowtail, and Bonito for two out of three days effort.

10/21/22 CAP'N JACK bottom fished in 250+ feet of water for a nice catch of big Goldies and Baqueta (the tan grouper).

10/22/22 HILLBILLY YACHT and EL Sueno fished San Esteban for big Yellowtail and Bonito on the troll and bottom fish.

10/23/22 SAND DOLLAR fished the Turner lighthouse for Yellowtail and Bonito, then moved north near Eagle's Nest for Goldies and a huge Pinto Bass.

10/26/22 GATOR BAIT, SAND DOLLAR and CAP'N JACK had near limits at Turner for Bonito. SAND DOLLAR also fished Dead Man for nice Yellowtail and near Eagle's Nest for big Goldies.

10/31/22 4 PLAY, CAP'N JACK, HILLBILLY YACHT, and GATOR BAIT all had good luck trolling around Dead Man for Yelllowtail, some of huge size and some break-offs. Lobo Marinos/sea lions figured out that the trollers were producing easy catches for them over the next week. Reportedly, "Bunker", Pink and Purple colors were working well.


Los Lobos said "Thanks" for the snacks.

11/02/22 CAP'N JACK, SAND DOLLAR, and TSIGINE caught Yellowtail at Turner.

11/06/22. A very busy day with up to 11 boats out, mainly around Turner/Dead Man, including GATOR BAIT, HILLBILLY YACHT, EL SUENO, and SAND DOLLAR for many limits of Yellowtail, big bonito, and bottom fish. CAP'N JACK concentrated on deep fishing and caught some very nice big Goldies. Sea Lions were notably busy around the trollers.

11/08/22 CAP'N JACK and SAND DOLLAR fished in deep waters for big bottom fish plus trolling for some Yellowtail around Turner and Dead Man. HILLBILLY YACHT and a couple of Mexican boats fished San Esteban for mucha Sardinera (leopard grouper), including a couple of the gold color form. GATOR BAIT, DAKOTA, and SAND DOLLAR fished

Turner and Dead Man for Yellowtail and bottom fish.. NIGHTWINGS finally got out on the water to Colorado Risco for nice Goldies and trigger fish, plus a couple of Pinto Bass to 17 pounds and 2 White Sea Bass to 44 pounds. Great day on the water with some overcast and calm seas. All returned safely!





11/11/22 SANDDOLLAR caught Yelllowtail and nice Goldies at Turner.

11/12/22. CAP'N JACK fished the Kino Estuary for three nice Cortez Halibut and Kelli's first Sea of Cortez fish! SANDDOLLAR had a "Good Day" at Turner for Yellowtail and Goldies.

EL SUENO got a couple of Yellowtail at Turner before having his day cut short by mechanical problems. TSIGINE caught Yellowtail at Dead Man.

11/23/22. SANDDOLLAR fished Turner in four foot swells for Goldies. 64-66 degree water and tough fishing.

In general, a good month for Yellowtail and Bonita (early one) when trolling, some good bottom fishing and jiggling, and Sardinera at Esteban trolling and casting near shore.

This month another reminder on proper VHF radio use.

For the lack of a proper term, I will title this "calling in the blind". Calling in the blind is when you pick up your mic and start talking to someone without first establishing contact. You have no idea if the person your are calling is actually listening.

The proper way to call on the VHF is by establishing contact with the party you are calling. IE: Rescue One, Rescue One, Rescue One, and then giving your call sign. Once the party you are calling has answered, then you can give them your information knowing that you have established contact.

Remember that VHF channel 26 is for calling and emergencies only. All other traffic is to be handled on a working channel.

Please remember to check all your safety equipment to make sure it is in good working order and up to date. Make sure it is readily accessible in case of need.

I am again looking for volunteer radio operators for Rescue One. We have 8 days a month that we need to cover. Please contact me at RNanro@aol.com or call 662-242-0277.
