#### Sustaining the Turnaround - Fiscal 2023

(October 1, 2022 - September 30, 2023)

Fiscal 2023 was the first complete season that we have had since 2019. There was a full menu of meals, indoor and outdoor activities, and the addition of new Club merchandise to sell. The turnaround that started at the end of Fiscal 2022 continued into Fiscal 2023. We cautiously budgeted for a contribution to the General Reserve, and we exceeded our expectations. Our contribution to the General Reserve for Fiscal 2023 was \$15,180.00 USD.

#### THE CLUB'S CAPITAL FUND is used for purchasing

various types of items that are expected to have a lifespan of more than a year.

While the Capital Fund is primarily funded by an allocation from the Annual Benefit Dinner, various fundraising activities such as Yard sales, Key Lime pie sales, Burnam Bags, as well as the Bar Tip Jar contribute to the Capital Fund. (The Bar Tip Jar contributed \$833.75 USD to the Capital Fund in Fiscal 2023.)

During Fiscal 2023 the following expenditures were made using the Capital Fund:

Upgrades to sound system

At the end of Fiscal 2023, (September 30, 2023) the balance in the Capital fund was \$16,814.21 USD.

#### **CLUB DEPORTIVO SHARES!**

Report from Club Deportivo's Charitable Giving Committee

Club Deportivo believes in charity. This tradition was established via the second item in the Club's MISSION statement, as included in the original Charter.

There are two funds in the Club treasury that provide support to the local Kino community, and many dedicated people work hard to raise this money.

The first pot of money is referred to as the **Board Allocated Fund**. Ten percent of your membership dues go to this fund, and it is used to help those in need of medical, nutritional, and/or educational assistance. It is also used to promote safety and youth development. Anyone asking to receive these funds must go to the Club office and fill out a request form detailing the need. The Charitable Giving committee, with the assistance of the Club management, then reviews, investigates, and make decisions about these requests. This fiscal year (October 1, 2022 – September 30, 2023) our budget was \$3348 US. We approved 11 individual requests that involved helping to pay for medication, special tests, surgery expenses, transportation costs, and medical equipment. In addition, we have helped pay for medication for the needy at the pharmacy, and with medical supplies at the Centro de Salud. We also acquired 4 wheelchairs, (2 new and 2 used), and 2 new oxygen tanks, which are available for loan from the club.

Our budget for this fiscal year is \$3845.

(Sometimes a small amount can make a big difference in our local community!)

The second fund is the **Charity Fund**. This is made up mostly of money generated through the Annual Benefit Dinner/Auction/Raffle and other fund-raising events conducted by the Club and its members. We also receive donations from individual people.

The Benefit Dinner has been an annual event since 2012. Funds raised are awarded to various groups in the Kino community, including the schools, Red Cross, and other social programs. Groups receiving donations must go through an application process, and once approved, are assigned tasks to help hold the event.

#### How your contributions are used.

The Benefit Dinner of 2023 was another huge success. This dinner raised \$413,700 MXN pesos for the **Charity Fund**— more than at any other event in the past! Some of these funds have been distributed already. Right off the top, 40% went to Club Deportivo. We realize that the Club must remain financially healthy to be able to give aid to the local community.

Even then, our pool of money in the **Charity Fund** to donate was quite large. Based on the needs of the participating organizations, we have already allocated \$ 233,725 MXN pesos. We have 1 remaining group that is still in process. We also have some reserve funds from previous dinners (\$157,093 MXN pesos).

The table below shows the proceeds and allocations of 2023 charitable fund-raising activities, plus the Emergency Reserves from previous years.

The committee feels strongly that donated funds must be used wisely and responsibly. Therefore, we monitor how benefitting groups use our donations, including requiring receipts for goods and services purchased with our donated funds. Requests are researched as best as possible. So, each group does not necessarily receive the same amount of money. We try to make sure that any available alternative funding (government programs, community resources. etc.) is used before we allocate money, so not all requests are approved.

We also keep a reserve from previous dinners for emergencies — currently \$49,484.70 MXN pesos.

There are many needs in this community. We strive to address these as best as possible.

Thank you for your continued commitment to Club Deportivo and its important role in our Kino Community. The Charitable Giving Committee welcomes your questions and suggestions.

# THE FISHING REPORT

Reporting Period: October 24, 2023 to November 25, 2023.

Note: Missing dates normally mean that the wind contributed to boats not going out to fish.

10/26/2023 In general fishing has been slow this month with high water temperatures remaining over 80 degrees at the islands. But some signs of hope were showing up and Yellowtail are starting to be landed along with Sierra, nice Bonita, and even a few Dorado south of Turner and towards the "Crossroads" by GATOR BAIT, SAND DOLLAR AND TSIGINE. GATOR BAIT caught bottom fish on 25 and 27 October. SAND DOLLAR also reported only both fish on 10/26 in 82 degree water at Esteban. EL SUENO fished Turner for some small Goldies and a couple of Dorado, then scouted toward the Crossroads bottom fishing. Then they landed a White Sea Bass of around 50+ pounds in over 400 feet of water. That is unusually deep for that species but maybe that is where they have been hiding out. There have been no other reports of that species this Fall.

10/28 to 11/07 Fishing remained spotty with sea surface temperatures beginning to drop and Yellowtail showing up more and most catches being bottom fish. SAND DOLLAR did report 81-82 degree water at Willard., but only bottom fish and no Yellowtail.

11/06 NIGHTWINGS fished from shore at Christmas Tree and managed to land a small Sierra, a decent Corvina, and two keeper Cortez Halibut. It was a nice day there but the fishing was really slow except for two brief flurries of action.

11/07 TSIGINE caught bottom fish and Yellowtail near Turner.







11/11 ESCAPE fished south of Turner for limits of Yellowtail. NIGHTWINGS went on a non-fishing (need new licenses) cruise/sea trial and saw temperatures from 72 to 76 degrees and marked some nice spots of fish but also went over large areas that were really looking dead. SAND DOLLAR caught Yellowtail at Dead Man trolling, then Suegra at Colorado Risco.

11/13 GOOD TIMES fished Turner for nice Yellowtail and a "First" for Gail Lenihan. Way to go Gail!

11/14 ESCAPE had a great day at Turner on big Goldies, some Dorado and Yellowtail. SAND DOLLAR caught Yellowtail and bottom fish including Suegra (Mother-in-Law). EL SUENO returned to Turner for Yellowtail and bottom fish and GOOD TIMES caught Yellowtail and big Bonita. EL PATO caught nice Yellowtail south of Turner, then decided to try trolling with an old cedar plug for fun. He quickly landed a big Yellowtail and a surprisingly big surprise Dorado.

11/15 GATOR BAIT made a short trip to Turner but was forced to return with an undetermined boat issue after trolling up a couple of Yellowtail. SAND DOLLAR reported limits of Yellowtail at Turner and Dead Man on the 9th, 13th and 15th along with Goldies, and one grouper on the 15th.

11/16-24 Lots of wind, some boats out on calmer days but no reports. Water is down to around 74 to 76 degrees.
