Hello & welcome to winter in Kino Bay!

The winters consist of occasional rain showers, but predominantly windy afternoons & evenings. This brings a wind chill upon our area in surprisingly rapid fashion. Make sure to prepare for this by insuring your vehicles are in good working order and you keep stocked drinking water, a blanket, first aid kit and a communication device such as cell phone and / or VHF radio. **Most importantly, check out & check in with Rescue 1 staff** via VHF Channel 24 or by telephone (242-0321) during working hours.

Speaking of working hours, remember to **plan in accordance with the new business hours** at the club. On Monday thru Saturdays the hours of operation are 8:00 am to 12:00 pm and 2:00 pm to 5:00 pm. The club facility is closed from 12:00 pm to 2:00 pm daily. **The new library is open all day.** The club is closed on Sunday's with the exception of planned events such as breakfasts and church. If you have an item that requires the assistance of our Club Staff, please see Filiburto or Betty during business hours. **If they are busy or your needs are going to require a bit of time to complete**, they will ask that you fill out a small request form. This enables the manager to prioritize and route the work requests. Please be patient as there are hundreds of members with needs and requests as well as daily staff business.

As always we are on the lookout for **volunteers to assist Rescue 1** in a variety of ways. If you want more information or would like to help Rescue 1 or the **Medical First Responders** please give me a call (242-0548) or give a note with your contact information to Fili or Betty. We will provide the equipment & training to help you help your community. We are currently in need of **Volunteer Radio Operators for Christmas Day** and New Years Day holidays. ARTICLE VII OF THE BY-LAWS STATES:

B. Any member who has paid dues for the current calendar year shall be deemed an active member of the Club and shall have the responsibilities, privileges and benefits of membership.

C. Any member who has not paid dues for the current calendar year shall be deemed an inactive member and shall not be entitled to participate in any Club activities nor cast a vote in person or by proxy.

H. Temporary memberships may be made available to qualified persons under such terms and conditions as the Administrative Board shall determine. Temporary members shall receive a temporary membership card and shall be entitled to the privileges and benefits of members. Temporary members cannot vote, cannot bring guests to Club functions and shall not receive newsletters nor have their name published in the Club directory.

K. All active and temporary members are entitled to use Club facilities. Use of special facilities such as the kitchen and office equipment is subject to such rules as may be prescribed by the Administrative Board. All such usage must be scheduled with the Club manager.

L. Members are encouraged to bring guests to Club functions. However, a person may be a guest only two times in a calendar year regardless of who the host member may be.

Dues for 2016 are \$91 USD that may be paid in USD, pesos or by check. Thank you for respecting our Charter and By-laws.

VICTOR (TEQUILA VICTOR) CORDERO, passed away in mid-October in Nogales, Arizona. Victor was a Club member in the late 80's and in the 1990's.

ROBERT (DIGGER) HARRIS, Mary Schulman wrote that Robert passed away on October 31, 2015, in New Braunfels, TX. He was a member of Club Deportivo in the late 80,s and 1990's.

TROY LEE STAMAN, was not a Club member, but was a frequent visitor to Kino and well known by many in Kino. Troy died of heart failure on November 16, 2015, at the age of 63, in Scottsbluff, Nebraska. He enjoyed being a pilot, hang gliding scuba diving, jet skiing and fishing.

He visited Kino a few times a year for many years and at one time lived at KBRV Park. He worked farming in Nebraska and had plans to retire and move to his beloved Sea of Cortez.

Fishing

Reporting Period: October 25 to November 25, 2015

Note: Missing dates normally mean that the wind contributed to boats not going out to fish.

10/27 PERRYDIZE trolled Isla Turner for some small yellowtail and one very fat bonito, first of the season.

10/28 PERRYDIZE returned to Turner, trolling for a few more yellowtail, but no more bonito. He reported temperatures down to high 70s west of the island. EL PATO also reported catching yellowtail at Deadman.

10/29 EL PATO fished the Turner area, getting a nice catch of 8 to 12 pound yellowtail and one about 15 pounds, off the reef at the south end of Turner. He also caught a really nice barred pargo or "coconaco" there while jigging with bait. He also reported lots of trigger fish.

11/2 EL SUENO was trolling the Deadman and south reef catching five sierra before hooking and fighting a large sailfish that hit a trolled pink Storm lure. They got to see a lot of jumps before it broke off under throat after pulling a lot of line and turning back toward them. GATOR BAIT fished all of the way to Isla Esteban but did not find much interested in biting. There was also an unconfirmed report of a large rooster fish being caught in this area around this time.

11/8 SUZIE BELL went to Turner for a good day of fishing, catching a mix of sierra, rockies and bottom fish by trolling and bottom fishing.

11/9 RED ROVER caught 6 small yellowtail at Dead Man, 10 small brownies (sardinera) at Eagle's Nest, and goldies and 2 white sea bass at Punta Willard.

11/16 GATOR BAIT fished hard at Isla San Pedro for billfish but met with no success.

11/21 GATOR BAIT had a great day at Turner and Dead Man, catching 6 decent yellowtail, 20 bonito, and a skipjack, all trolling. Pink was the best color. Rumor has it that Sea Bass lived up to his name and landed both a black and a white sea bass. Apparently he hit them jigging near the



south end of Turner and they both weighed over 50 pounds (limit of available scale). Red Rover estimated the black at near 75 pounds.

11/22 GATOR BAIT returned to Turner to try to continue their streak and got limits of bonito. SAND DOLLAR caught limits of small yellowtail and bottom fish at Turner.























































11/23 RED ROVER trolled Dead Man for 18 yellowtail and 2 bonito.

11/24 EL SUENO found limits of yellowtail to 15 pounds at Turner. NIGHTWINGS shore fished Red Rock Beach for Cortez halibut but only caught a single rockie. There have been reports of halibut being caught from shore between the "shrimp farm" and Kino Bay Estates by SI SENOR from shore. GATOR BAIT caught limits of yellowtail trolling by 0830 and spent the rest of the trip trying to locate the bonito unsuccessfully. LOS COMPADRES caught two very large black sea bass. OVERCAST caught four white sea bass off the end of Turner jigging. DAKOTA was also out jigging at Turner and landed 2 white sea bass and caught limits of yellowtail, but released all but 8.

11/25 EL PATO trolled around the Turner Dead Man area also for yellowtail and lost the only bonito they hooked right at the boat. PERRYDIZE fished the Turner Dead Man also for more yellowtail. Also heard that SEA BASS struck again for two more white sea bass. NIGHTWINGS and SAND DOLLAR drove out to Christmas Tree to try shore fishing and were rewarded with six nice halibut to eight pounds, four corvina to three pounds and an assortment of other species. The only downer was when their right arms fell off after casting for over four hours straight.
