Charitable Giving Committee



Club Deportivo has a commitment to **help the Kino community**. This committee is responsible for making funding recommendations from two different types of charitable funds. These are the Board Allocated Funds and The Line Item Charity Account.

Line Item Charity Account

This is primarily funded by **special events** and **private donations**. Last year, the main funding event was the Benefit Dinner held on January 31, 2015, during which **171,305 pesos** were raised. This money was given



to 19 different programs and schools in the Kino community, including:

- Familias Unidas,
- The Breakfast Program,
- The Drug and Alcohol Program,
- Comision Nacional de Emergencia,
- Kino Bay Spay & Neuter,
- KLK Scholarship Program,
- The Diabetic Club,
- Music For Kino Kids and
- Genia's For a Better Tomorrow.

Support was given through cash donations, and/or donations of material and labor.

The **next benefit dinner** is to be held on March 12, 2016. Preparations are underway to make this another huge success.

Board Allocated Funds

This is another available fund which include approximately 10 % of membership dues. (This is one, of many, reasons to be a member!) Those asking for help complete assistance requests at the Club, and these are then reviewed by the committee. Support has been given for a variety of needs, including medical treatment and testing, medication, funeral costs, and some support for cultural and sporting

events. Alternative funding is always considered before giving funding, and priority is given to emergency and medical issues, especially for children and the elderly.

A portion of your membership dues are **at work trying to help those in need throughout our community**.

FINANCIAL RESULTS - 2015

Membership Dues for 2015 were \$39,905_{USD} constituting 52% of our net receipts. The Bar and Kitchen combined netted \$26,432_{USD}. Insurance Commissions totaled \$7,958_{USD}, and the balance of our receipts came from the Storage Lot, Outdoor Activities, and Merchandise sales.

2015 was again a year with some Unusual Expenditures. These are projects or equipment expenses that are not recurring, and for 2015 added up to \$3,856_{USD}.

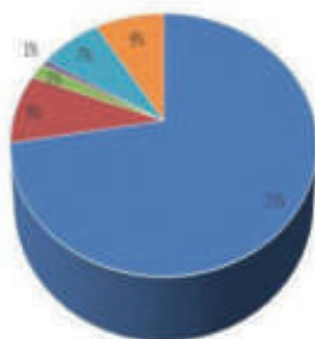
General Operating Costs for 2015 were \$61,394_{USD}. This is the total cost of operating our Club. It is comprised of: payroll, utilities, taxes, general repairs and maintenance for upkeep of the building, legal, accounting and bank fees, Rescue One supplies, and office supplies.

Additionally we fulfilled our annual commitment to Charity - (10% of the previous year's membership dues). A total of \$4,695_{USD} was paid out over the year.

Overall, our net receipts exceeded our expenditures, contributing \$7,269_{USD} to our General Reserve.

at December 31, 2015

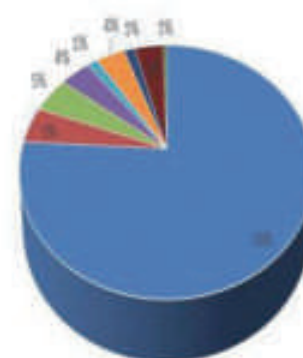


Bank Accounts Cash

Our Club ended the year with \$92,675_{USD} in assets - \$74,984_{USD} in cash and bank accounts. At the end of the year, \$8,039_{USD} was due from ongoing raffle ticket sales, and \$7,040_{USD} was due from continuing donations to the Carpet Replacement Project. Other assets were miscellaneous receivables and inventories.

Current liabilities at the end of the year (and paid in 2016) totaled \$4,325_{USD}. Non-Current Liabilities, made up of Funds and Reserves payable in the more distant future totaled \$18,014_{USD}, leaving our General Reserve at \$70,336_{USD}.

Kino Ladies Klub (KLK) Scholarship Program

This amazing program is currently paying for 25 high school students in Kino Viejo. We are now accepting donations for the next school year. Because the peso to US dollar exchange rate keeps changing, the committee has decided to reduce the price of each scholarship that is paid in US funds. **The cost to support one student for one semester will be \$110.00 US this year,** down from \$120.00 US. This year the price for each student for one semester has increased from 1500 pesos to 1700 pesos.

If you are interested in paying for a specific student, we will find one for you or you can get the name of a student to us that you want to support. All students must fill out an application and be accepted by the committee by meeting **two requirements.** One being a GPA of 80

or better and the second, be willing to donate 3 hours each week at one of the two elementary schools. Once a student is accepted into the program they will continue until graduation or until they fail to meet one or both of the requirements.

This program is run completely on donations, we hope to be able to add new students to this program and that number will be determined by the amount of donations received. We look forward to hearing from you. Any questions can be answered by any of the following committee members:

Fishing

Reporting Period: December 26 to January 25, 2015/16

Note: Missing dates normally mean that the wind contributed to boats not going out to fish.

The new year started with lots of wind, so reports have been scarce.

01/03 DAKOTA caught bottom fish at the south end of Turner. PERRYDIZE got limits of goldies, three small yellowtail, and four brownies. SAND DOLLAR caught two white sea bass near 20 pounds and one "little" black sea bass of 176 pounds (80kilos) at the south end of Turner. JAYHAWKER also fished Turner and caught six yellowtail and a good catch of bottom fish. RED ROVER also caught nice yellowtail at Esteban that day.

01/04 HILLBILLY YACHT went to San Esteban for big limits of nice yellowtail and nine "brownies".

01/05 DAKOTA caught bottom fish at the south end of Turner and 8 yellowtail at Deadman.

01/06 ROSIE boat went to Esteban for limits of 20+ pound yellowtail, all trolling.

01/09 SAND DOLLAR ran out early to Dead Man and got limits of yellowtail trolling before the waves came up. PERRYDIZE fished the south end of Turner and then Dead Man to catch limits of yellowtail and one bonito. DOUBLE TROUBLE also reported limits of yellowtail at Dead Man.

01/15 PERRYDIZE had a good day at Turner with near limits of yellowtail. DAKOTA also caught limits of yellowtail and "lots of goldies and sand bass".
































































01/16 NIGHTWINGS tried shore fishing at Christmas Tree but it was very slow, only catching three small flounder (one keeper).

01/17-22 Lots of windy days....











01/23 Looked like a very nice day, but the Turner area held some waves to three feet, so pretty bumpy. JAYHAWKER went to Turner and trolled for 9 yellowtail and bottom fished for 14 cabrilla, so not a bad day, just tough fishing. DAKOTA also was at Turner, trolling for nine yellowtail of mixed sizes, and jigging/bottom fishing for a small 12# white sea bass and a mix of goldies and rockies.

FYI: Our handheld VHF radio quit working after only one year, so we decided to try out the electrician that Perry Wilkes mentioned, Sergio. He found a loose wire and fixed it and now it works like new. I was amazed he was able to fix it and was very economical, so we have to recommend him also.
