### An opportunity to help the needlest among us... Hello. My name is Patricia González. I write to you with a desire to gather despensas (boxes of basic foods) to take to the most needy families of Kino Viejo. As a member of the community who was born and grew up here, I am aware of the fundamental needs such as electrical power and food to provide for children or grandchildren. Years ago in the community of Bahía de Kino there was a food aid program for low-income families. Unfortunately this disappeared over time because the aid often did not reach those who really needed it. Today I turn to you to address the possibility of resuming this program. I hope you can help with supplies to support people with real needs. These include people who are disabled, older and no longer able to work, grandparents who took charge of their grandchildren who were orphaned when their parents died or whose parents abandoned them, as well as people with illnesses who find it difficult to earn a living. Their grandchildren are classmates in my children's school, and older people who I have known for years who are often forgotten by their children and left to fend for themselves, the same as the grandchildren they care for. My wish is to contribute to my community and do something so that these people will have food in their homes and are able to cheer their days a little in December. The holidays are difficult for them. In the past weeks I have visited these families to know the conditions in which they live and the hard life they lead. There are approximately 25 families in these conditions. If you are willing to be a part of this and want to help, you can contact me. Together we can make it possible for these people to receive such help on December 22 and pass the Christmas and New Year dates a little happier. We can also make it possible for you to meet the families who receive the help, if you would like, and we can help each other be part of this. I am sure that each family will thank you for helping make sure they have some food in their homes on those dates, just as I thank you for supporting this noble cause. - And on the all impotent drink cart Louise Thompson and Carolyn Martine.


#### And the winners were:

### **KLK (Kino Ladies Klub)**



This amazing program is currently paying for 37 high school students in Kino Viejo. We are now accepting donations for the next semester. The cost to support one student for one semester is \$100.00 US, or \$200.00 US for one school year. This year the price for each student for the spring semester has remained at 1500 pesos. Of these 37, we have three students who are receiving a full ride from the Maria Peral Memorial Scholarship Fund. Their requirements to remain on the program are the same.

If you are interested in paying for a specific student, we will find one for you; or you can give us the name of a student you want to support. All students must fill out an application and be accepted by the committee by meeting two requirements, one being a GPA of 80 or better, and the second, donate three hours each week at one of the two elementary schools. Once a student is accepted into the program, they will continue until graduation or until they fail to meet one or both of the requirements.

**May 25** HILL BILLY YACHT?ROSIE (Late Report from last season) huge grouper (Baqueta) from Isla Angel de la Guarda.

October 26 LA DONNA I fished Turner for limits of yellowtail and one bonito in an hour and a half.
October 28 NIGHTWINGS fished the shore at Estero Santa Rosa (Christmas Tree area) for seven species including 4 Cortez halibut, 6 small to medium corvina, triggerfish, Paloma Pompano, "rockies", mojarra/sargo?, and a 7.5 pound Sierra, which was a real challenge on a Mitchell 300.

**November 3** GATOR BAIT caught limits of yellowtail at Turner and San Esteban. JAYHAWKER went to Turner for successful bottom fishing.

**November 4** GATOR BAIT and PERRYDIZE both fished San Esteban for limits of big yellowtail and some sardinera (AKA brownies or leopard grouper), all trolling. ROSIE boat fished the Willard area for Goldies, nice baqueta groupers, and a 35 pound White Sea bass.

**November 5** NIGHTWINGS shore fished again (boat broken), at Christmas Tree area for one 5 pound halibut and 8 corvina to 3 pounds, all on Kastmaster type spoons. All were caught at the "tree".

HANNAH RYAN fished the north side of San Esteban for limits of yellowtail from 20 to around 30 pound monsters, all "on the troll".

**November 6** ROSIE boat trolled San Esteban for limits of nice yellowtail.

November 8-10 An unidentified boat (with a Road Runner" on the side) spent three days near Isla Patos and returned with full limits of big sardinera, some decent yellowtail, big trigger fish and at least one "Pargo Amarillo", or yellow snapper. They thought it was a red snapper, but the golden rear half of the fish identified the species as a "yellow pargo". GATOR BAIT also made multiple trips to Turner -Dead Man and San Esteban for limits of big yellowtail. SAND DOLLAR fished Turner and Dead Man for bottom fish and a couple of yellowtail.

**November 11** HILL BILLY YACHT went to Queens Rock for limits of yellowtail and sardinera (brownies). **November 12** EL PATO tried Turner and saw little action.

**November 13** ROSIE boat fished San Esteban for 7 large yellowtail from 25 to 28 pounds and a few brownies. NIGHTWINGS went back to the beaches at Sta. Rosa for two halibut to 7 pounds. A "MYSTERY BOAT" got nothing at San Esteban but yellowtail to 20 pounds at Turner.

November 15 SAND DOLLAR fished from Colorado Risco to the Eagle Nest area for a lot of bottom fish, especially "Mother-in-Laws". PERRYDIZE trolled Turner, mainly at the south end for 5 yellowtail. NIGHTWINGS finally made out to Esteban trolling and jigging the northeast side for bottom fish, one bonito and one sardinera, then stopped to jig around Colorado Risco for a double hook-up of pinto bass to 15 pounds and some nice cabrilla. Temperatures were 65-66 at Esteban and 75 at Colorado Risco.

**November 17** HANNAH RYAN fished north and west of Dead Man limits of rockies, goldies, a sheephead, and 3 pretty "Popeye catalufa" (Mexfish.com).





#### In accordance with our liquor license, the following is not permitted at the Club:

- No outside drinks may be brought in. If you would like a certain type of liquor at the bar, ask the Bar Director.
