The 1917 Constitution was drafted in Santiago de Querétaro during the Mexican Revolution. The Mexican constitution of 1917 was the first such constitution in the world to include social rights and served as a model for the Weimar Constitution of 1919 and the Russian Constitution of 1918.







December 28 ROSIE boat went to Isla San Pedro and found 61 degree water and caught 9 small grouper, and various cabrilla ("goldies" and "rockies").

December 31 SAND DOLLAR caught three yellowtail and a few bottom fish in 63 degree water on a slow day near Turner.

January 3/2020 PERRYDIZE fished the Turner area for bottom fish but no yellowtail caught. DAKOTA fished San Esteban and caught nice yellowtail in around 150 feet of water while trolling and some nice sardinera (unconfirmed).

January 08 HILLBILLY YACHT FISHED Queen's Rock in 51 degree water and 8 "brownies"/ sardinera.

January 13 SEA HAVEN went to Esteban and caught good bottom fish and one authentic pargo rojo. ROSIE boat and PERRYDIZE fished Esteban for bottom fish.

January 14 NIGHTWINGS fished Colorado Risco to Eagle nest for a mix of bottom fish and larger goldies near the point off Eagle Nest.

January 16 SEA HAVEN went to Pedro for five nice grouper.

Report: Day 1 -5 Nice dorado Day 2- 3 small sail fish (catch and release only) Day 4 skunked Day 5 3 kilo Dorado Day 6- 2 small yellow fin tuna Day 7 -8.1

Sorry no photos and few fish reported during a windy and cold period.



- Absolutely NO underage person may consume, buy nor hold alcohol. (The legal drinking age in Mexico is 18. If you have young guests who are at least 18, please make sure they carry an ID on them)
