**W**elcome back, especially you boaters and fishermen. This past summer has been a bit quieter than last summer. We didn't have to build a proper launch ramp! Thanks Butch and Esteban for the work, and a host of you boaters for your contributions.

The issue of Kino Port closures has come up again, and it is very important we all understand that the Port Captain has full authority to close the Port, restricting all boaters from venturing out based on information he has in hand, including Mexican forecasts. Fines can be assessed to boaters ignoring the Captain's announced closures. Many of us feel we should be able to go out at our own risk with our Buoy Weather forecast and our local experience. As Rescue One, operating in cooperation with Mexican Law, we request that you all observe the Port Captain's closures. # Membership

## CLUB MEMBERSHIP POLICIES

- Members must be 18 years or older
- All guests must sign the Guest Book to not jeopardize our liquor license.
- Guests of Members are invited to participate in two (2) activities per season, such as social hour, meals, games or sporting events.
- Members may invite family members or friends (if their stay is limited to no more than two weeks per season) to participate in the above two activities as well as all meals and Friday social hours.
- Annual dues are \$100 per person, plus a one-time initiation fee of \$10.

## TEMPORARY MEMBERSHIP

- \$35 for Thirty (30) days per person
- \$15 for Seven (7) days per person
- Temporary Membership includes participation in all Club activities, but temporary members MAY NOT INVITE GUESTS to Club functions, may not vote nor receive the Newsletter, and may not have their name published in the Club Directory.

## INACTIVE MEMBERSHIP

- \$25 Annual Dues
- May have no participation in the Club
- May have their name published in the Club Directory
- May receive mailed Newsletters twice per year
- Must have been a regular member at some time

## LIFETIME MEMBERSHIP

- Current and past Presidents, and their spouses; Founding Members and Endowment Members become Lifetime Members
- Their dues are waived in perpetuity and they are entitled to all Club benefits.

## HONORARY MEMBERSHIP

- May be offered in recognition of extraordinary service to the Club and/or the Kino Community; it may be temporary or permanent
- Members shall be entitled to all rights and privileges, except they may not vote

- Absolutely NO underage person may consume, buy nor hold alcohol. (The legal drinking age in Mexico is 18. If you have young guests who are at least 18, please make sure they carry an ID on them)

Please help us obey the laws set by the State of Sonora and help us keep our bar open!
