RESCUE ONE

Hello and Welcome back Kino, Folks!

I hope all of you have enjoyed a safe and enjoyable summer. Temperatures are dropping and Summer Club maintenance projects and improvements will be apparent as you return.

Most critical and noteworthy is the serious and professional rebuild of our boat ramp, organized and managed by Butch Holveck. Our hats off to Butch and his wife Liz Carmen, who took the initiative to tackle this project on behalf of the community. A proper and safe ramp is a key to a viable Rescue One program, which has provided safety to thousands of boaters in the Sea of Cortez over the years. Butch reports work is nearing completion, and evening low tides in November will provide a good opportunity for this necessary night time activity.

The VHF channel 24 we use for Rescue One continues to experience the Harmonic Interference we reported on last year. Recent activities seem to occur due to transmissions from the Baja Peninsula. Unfortunately, this is a phenomenon we have little control over. This activity is a distraction but does not impact your usage of the radio. Rescue One is still operating on VHF Channel 24 or by telephone as usual, via Club Staff and volunteers.

10/12 EL PATO and GATOR BAIT fished the Turner area on a sunny calm day that ended early for all of the right reasons. Yellowtail, bonito and sierra were caught trolling Rapala X-Rap 30s and similar lures around Dead Man and the south end of Turner. Large schools of bait were reported and many of the fish were caught in less

than 80 feet of water. Launching at the older ramp presented no problems if careful and watchful for the nearby rocks.

10/13 GATOR BAIT caught limits of yellowtail and bonito again at Turner, mostly around Dead Man, and home by 10:30am. Another calm clear day with 78 degree water.

10/15- windy weather, no fishing.

10/18 EL PATO was at Turner for limits of bonito and a few yellowtail.

10/19 EL PATO at Dead Man for limits of yellowtail and half limits of bonito, returning by 10:30 (again). Trolling still working for all species.

10/26 Turner and Dead Man still producing yellowtail for trollers but bait schools diminishing but yellowtail getting bigger (to 18 pounds). Limits by mid-morning trolling.
