The Prez Says...

Welcome back to Kino Bay!

It is great to be back to a place and people that make it easier to remember to count our blessings instead of dwelling on all the things that have gone wrong in our lives. We are indeed lucky to be able to come here to Kino. The beauty of the beach itself, the sunrises and sunsets, and friends are more than I could have dreamed of as a child.

This year some major decisions about our Club will have to be made, and these **decisions must be made by the entire club membership**, not just the Board of Directors. The Club's comodato will expire in 2026, and there is only a small chance it will be renewed. The land that the clubhouse, parking lot, and storage lot sit on is owned by the State of Sonora, and they have been loaning it to us for the past 30 years. Now, the present state government has decided that they want the land back. Even if the state government changes, and it looks like a new administration will renew the comadato, it would be foolish to keep putting money into a building that sits on land we do not own, and that can be taken from us at any time.

RESCUE ONE

Welcome back to our fabulous winter vacation paradise. Since arriving here this week I have noticed an ongoing problem communicating with Rescue One. Now it could be rescue 1's problem which we will have fixed shortly if it is. I would suspect tho that we need to check our own radios. The most common problem is the antenna connection on the back of your radio (PL259 connector) Any corrosion or even being loose will cause havoc on your VHF.

There are several other areas the boaters need to check as they get ready for their boating season. These are the unseen areas that can cause big problems if left unattended too. Battery connections, bilge pumps, fire extinguishers, and hidden fuse blocks and connections. Just eyeball and make sure everything is clean and tight.

I know that we are in Mexico and the Coast guard is not around to check our safety equipment, but we still need to make sure we



TO FISH OR NOT TO FISH?



KNOW THE RULES BEFORE YOU GO FISHING!

- 4.9 The practice of sport-recreational fishing is subject to the following maximum catch limits:
- 4.9.1 For marine species, ten daily specimens per fisherman, with the following composition:
 - a) No more than five specimens of the same species.
 - b) In the case of shark, the maximum limit per fisherman per day will be a single specimen, which will be equivalent to five specimens of other species.
 - c) In the case of shad, dorado, roosterfish, and grouper/baya (*Mycteroperca jordani*), the maximum will be two specimens per fisherman per day, which will also be equivalent to five organisms of other species.
 - d) In the case of squid, the catch limit will be five specimens per fisherman per day.
- 4.9.3 In marine waters, sports-recreational fishing activities with boats whose trips have a duration of more than three days, the maximum cumulative number of specimens that may be captured by a sport fisherman will be the equivalent of three fishing days according to the quotas established in point 4.9.
- 4.10 Sport-recreational fishing cannot be carried out:
 - a) In closed areas and seasons.
 - b) Within 250 meters of vessels engaged in commercial fishing, fixed fishing gear, or floating.
 - c) Less than 250 meters from the shore of beaches frequented by bathers.
 - d) In areas of refuge, reserve, and protected natural areas; this activity will only be allowed under the terms and conditions established by the legal regulations applicable in said area.
- 4.11 The specimens retained in accordance with the quotas established will be the property of the holder of the permit of sports-recreational fishing and may not be commercialized.

Note: Missing dates normally mean that the wind contributed to boats not going out to fish.

June 7-15, 2019 NIGHTWINGS, sans boat fished from shore at Christmas Tree and off

the post at the Santa Rosa Estuary with chrome and chrome/blue KastMaster type spoons for a mix of small sandies/ spotted bay bass, small corvina and Paloma



pompano. They were quite game and jumped often. The fillets were good sautéed and with tarter sauce or green salsa. These are a different species from the more familiar Florida pompano and were caught commonly at the point as the tide was rising. They have some short sharp dorsal and ventral spines to be aware of.

Late September PERRYDIZE went out twice trolling for yellowtail and dorado but had no luck in hot (85 degree water).

October 16? and 19 GATOR BAIT went to Turner trolling with X-Raps (20s did best) and caught limits of decent yellowtail, then bottom fished at Dead Man for some goldies. Same results both days, some triple hook ups. No sign of bonito and water temperatures ranged between 76 and 78 degrees.

October 23 LA DONNA 1 caught limits of yellowtail at Turner and reported rumors of similar catches at Esteban.

Also heard second hand reports of BIG corvina being caught to the south of Kino from shore and in the shrimp farm channel, up to 10+ pounds. Pompano also reported at the estuary south of Jacqueline Condos.

No other reports or rumors.

A Report from the CHARITABLE GIVING COMMITTEE

Club Deportivo has a strong commitment to help the Kino community in as many ways as possible.

The Charitable Giving Committee tries to help the community through allocation of money from two different funds generated by the club. These are the Board Allocated Funds and The Charity Account.

The Charity Account is primarily funded by special events and private donations. Last year, the main funding event for this account was The Benefit Dinner held on March 9, 2019 during which 191,312 pesos were raised. From this amount, 153,050 was available to be given to 19 different participating programs and schools in the Kino community, including all of the various schools, as well as Kino programs like Cruz Roja, Familias Unidas, The Breakfast Programs, The Drug and Alcohol Program, Kino Bay Spay & Neuter, MACA, For a Better Tomorrow, Museo Comcaac, Unidad Basica de Rehabilitacion, and the Sala de Exhibicion de Especias. Support was given through cash donations, and/or donations of materials/supplies.

The next benefit dinner is to be held in March of 2020. Preparations are underway to make this another huge success.

The other available fund is Board allocated funds which include approximately 10 % of membership dues. (This is one of many reasons to be a member!) For this past fiscal year, there were 69,204 pesos available. Those asking for help complete assistance requests at the Club, and these are then reviewed by the committee. Support has been given for a variety of needs, including medical treatment and testing, medication, transportation, funeral costs, and some promotion of cultural and sporting events. Alternative funding is always considered before giving funding, and priority is given to emergency and medical issues, especially for children and the elderly.

A portion of your membership dues are at work trying to help those in need throughout our community.

Please show your support by being a member, and by attending and supporting the upcoming Benefit dinner.
