Hello & welcome back Kinoites!

I hope you all had an enjoyable and safe summer whether you traveled or stayed through the heat here in Kino Bay. As you may have noticed **the summer's wild weather has taken its toll on the area's infrastructure** in many ways, from washed out roadways to the unfortunate loss of some homes. The **beaches suffered erosion** in several spots as well as **accumulations of flotsam & jetsam**. Recovery efforts by the authorities have been slow in getting started but many club members, club staff and locals have begun doing what they can to assist in their neighborhoods.

Please be careful if you endeavor to be of assistance in getting our community back in order. Be mindful while traveling around town that many of the **back streets are washed out** and may have become impassable since you were last here. These hazards aren't always readily apparent, especially at night. If you plan on enjoying the beaches remember that **many critters take up habitation** in the newly formed piles of debris that were formed by the numerous storms that impacted the shore. Although you may spot your newest “treasure” in one of these piles, be cautious in attempting to retrieve it as something may have already adopted it.

Keep in mind that if you are going to venture out and see what's changed, whether by land or sea, **please check out & back in with “Rescue One”** on channel 24 or by telephone to the club staff. We can only help you if we know the destination of your adventure & expected return time.

Community Outreach

Hello everyone, great news

Over the summer the government has done some **extensive additions to the clinic in Old Kino.** They have added **an additional emergency exam room.** The purpose of this addition is to separate male and female for privacy. They have also added several additional rooms to accommodate more doctors. They have also eliminated the outside storage bodaga and have been able to bring the supplies into the main building. Now the supplies can be temperature controlled. They have worked on this project all summer and completed it about two weeks ago. They are reporting that **since the completion the wait time for**

patients has been cut in half. Up to now they have not been able to build an x-ray room and are suggesting monies be raised through the community of Kino.

Due to the flooding that we had this past summer, there have been several homes with extensive damage and some totally destroyed. The city of Hermosillo, the State of Sonora, DIF Clinic and the Red cross has done a wonderful job in **assisting the victims of the flood** with food, housing and some building materials. They have also brought in large amounts of dirt to the low lying areas on properties and streets. **There are still a lot of needs, such as building materials, household goods and clothing.**

This year we were able to deliver **65 backpacks filled with school supplies** to the children in Old Kino.

A private donation of \$5,000.USD was given to the children's breakfast program. We have been able to install a new commercial size septic system as the old system had failed. Also, we were able to replace the main gates on the property. The balance of the money is being used to operate the school bus, fuel and insurance for approximately a year and a half. Having the bus in operation they are able to pick up children who were not able to get to the breakfast program.

We are still in great need of school supplies, back packs, birthday gifts, coats, blankets and clothing.

Looking forward to the new season, everyone travel safe and see you soon. Thank you all for your support.

Kino Ladies Klub (KLK) Scholarship Program

The Scholarship Committee is pleased to announce that **we have funds to support 30 students** for the current semester. This Fall, we will be collecting more donations for the Spring Semester. **It costs \$120.00 (US), 1500 pesos or \$140.00 (Canadian) to support one student for one semester.** We pay the high school \$3480.00 (US) or 43,500 pesos for these 29 students. In return for this scholarship gift the students must

complete 3 hours of peer tutor time each week working with teachers or students at one of the two elementary schools in Kino. They also must keep their grades at 75% or above. We have 7 students who are being supported privately through our program. **If you are interested in paying for a specific student**, please see one of us and we will find a special student for you. David Hardy (CALUMA 2), a long-time Kino resident and Club Deportivo member passed away in Sturgis, SD, on August 17, 2015. David and Mary wintered in Kino, living at the Caluma Bungalows for 30 years. He loved fishing the waters of the Sea of Cortez, and was often a ramp manager for Rescue One rescues. As manager of the Caluma Bungalows he welcomed many new people to Kino, and showed us the ropes. He and his wife Mary, with her great singing voice, will be sorely missed in Kino.

Vern Neuberger (SEAWORTHY), was a long-time Kino resident and Club Deportivo member. Vern passed away in August 20, 2015, in Delta, CO he was 77 years old. He and Sandra spent many winters in Kino. He was an avid fisherman and was seen almost daily on his beloved Panga, SEAWORTHY. He felt that no vessel could compare with his Panga. In addition, he loved playing cards and cribbage. He is survived by his wife, Sandra, two daughters, five grandchildren, 13 great-grandchildren, a bother and two sisters.

William Kirtley Sr (BILL), passed away on August 22, 2015, at the age of 95 in Star, ID. He & Edith spent 23 winters in Kino & were Club Deportivo members for all of that time. Every year they would bring down a trailer full of clothes, toys, bikes & food to give to all of the locals

Fishing

Reporting Period: September to October 24, 2015

Note: Missing dates normally mean that the wind contributed to boats not going out to fish.

I have a NEW email if you can send me any fishing news or pictures: lyncurt0@gmail.com

Pre-September: Not many fishermen around, but those that have been out have reported sporadic catches of smaller dorado and bottom fish. LOS COMPADRES reported a nice catch of bottom fish south of Turner in very deep water, 400+ feet. They had one big yellowtail and at least one nice grouper along with the usual bottom fish. There was also a story that the halibut/flounder season was closed due to shrinking catches and heavy pressure on the local stocks.

9/25 PERRYDIZE took family out to south of Turner for a trolling catch of sierra, and a mess of rockies, goldies, salmon, and triggerfish in 300+’.

9/27 PERRYDIZE fished San Pedro Matir and caught one 5# dorado and one 4# yellowtail before switching to bottom fish including limits of goldies and a 4# hawkfish or chino mero. (a small bass like but colorful member of the “hawkfish” family). They also reported lots of dolphins and whales.

9/28 Unusual sighting of a burrowing owl at KBE by NIGHTWINGS.

10/12 NIGHTWINGS, MANANA MAYBE, and GATORBAIT all fished south of Turner and the Deadman areas. Water temperatures were 84-85 degrees. Sierra were plentiful for trollers and even on jigs. Additionally GATORBAIT caught one skipjack and NIGHTWINGS hoked and lost one dorado while jigging (more dorado were seen in the reef area). Bottom fishing brought good catches of goldies and bottom fish. No sign of yellowtail or

bonito. There was a second hand report of a Mexican boat coming in with limits of medium-sized sardinera while trolling and casting near rocky shores towards Willard. Dolphin were plentiful.

10/16 LA DONNA III went to Bahia Los Angeles on an overnigher to look for whale sharks, which they found, and caught one yellowtail and one dorado.

10/17 GATOR BAIT fished Pedro Matir for bottom fish including goldies, triggerfish and one small grouper in 300-500’.

10/22 PERRYDIZE tried Pedro Matir but was hampered by a tough swell and winds so went on back to Turner. They caught the same as before, sierra and one 10# toro or jack crevalle. GATOR BAIT went all of the way to San Lorenzo to troll but did not find much there. On the way back they encountered a huge bait boil “a couple of football fields long”, but it turned out to be skipjack. PERRYDIZE did find some cooler water in the 70s.

On the conservation side, below is a link to the World’s Aquarium site maintained by Vince Radice out of San Carlos on the dorado fishery and the banning of shipping of commercial catches of dorado to the US starting last August.

There are other links to stories on the Sea of Cortez including one on the nearly extinct vaquita, or harbor porpoise (smallest of all). It is interesting reading and reveals the latest efforts to clean up enforcement of illegal, unregistered commercial fishing in the Sea of Cortez. It seems that the Mexican navy is taking over the effort to catch nighttime gill netting by poachers in the protected zone between San Felipe and Puerto Penasco. The poaching is targeting the endangered toatava (for their air bladders) and killing turtles and vaquita as by-catch.
